The dress was rolled up in a towel and put in a trunk that went through the 1903 flood. The dress was yellowed with age and water. The dress is now in the possession of Mrs. C.J.D. Pearson who is a niece of the Tillie Cowins who wore the dress.

Surprisingly, the dress is machine made. The full skirt has two tucks. There is a string through the ruff sleeves and the neck. It could be worn by today's little girl and be very much in style.

As the Babas were her favorite food, she provided samples of this delicious dessert. The recipe follows.

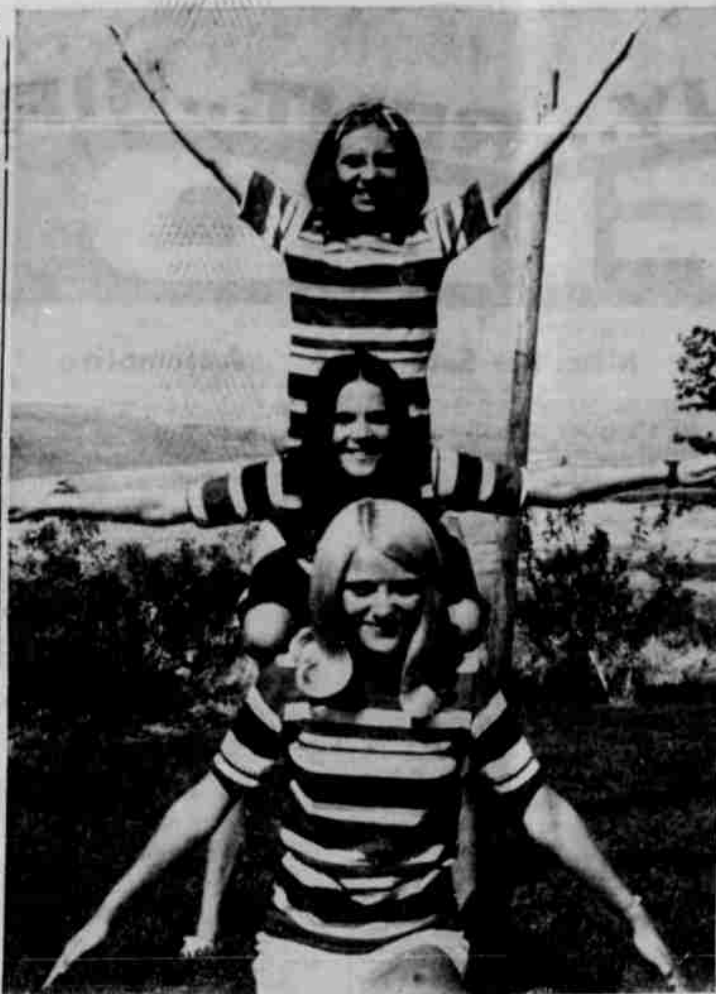
**Baby Orange Babas**  
1 pkg. yellow cake mix  
¾ cup sugar  
¾ cup water  
¾ cup orange juice  
3 tbsp. orange peel, slivered  
Prepare the batter from the cake mix. Place well greased paper hot cups on a baking sheet. Spoon batter into the cups until they are about ¾ full. Bake 375 degrees for 25 min. or until done.

Meanwhile make the syrup. Combine sugar, water, orange juice and orange peel. Cook for five minutes. When cakes are done, cool a minute or two then turn out of cups onto serving plate. Drizzle immediately with hot orange syrup. Soaking the cakes well. Chill and serve cold with whip cream.

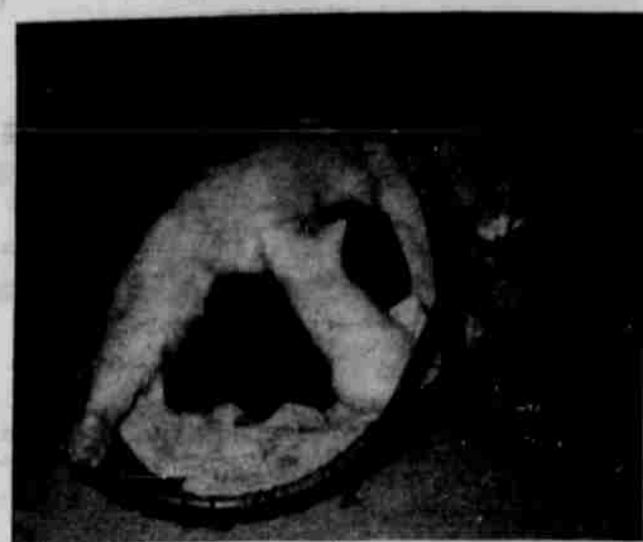
