the Senior Citizens gather for fun and food. They displayed in their booth all the craft articles they have made this year.



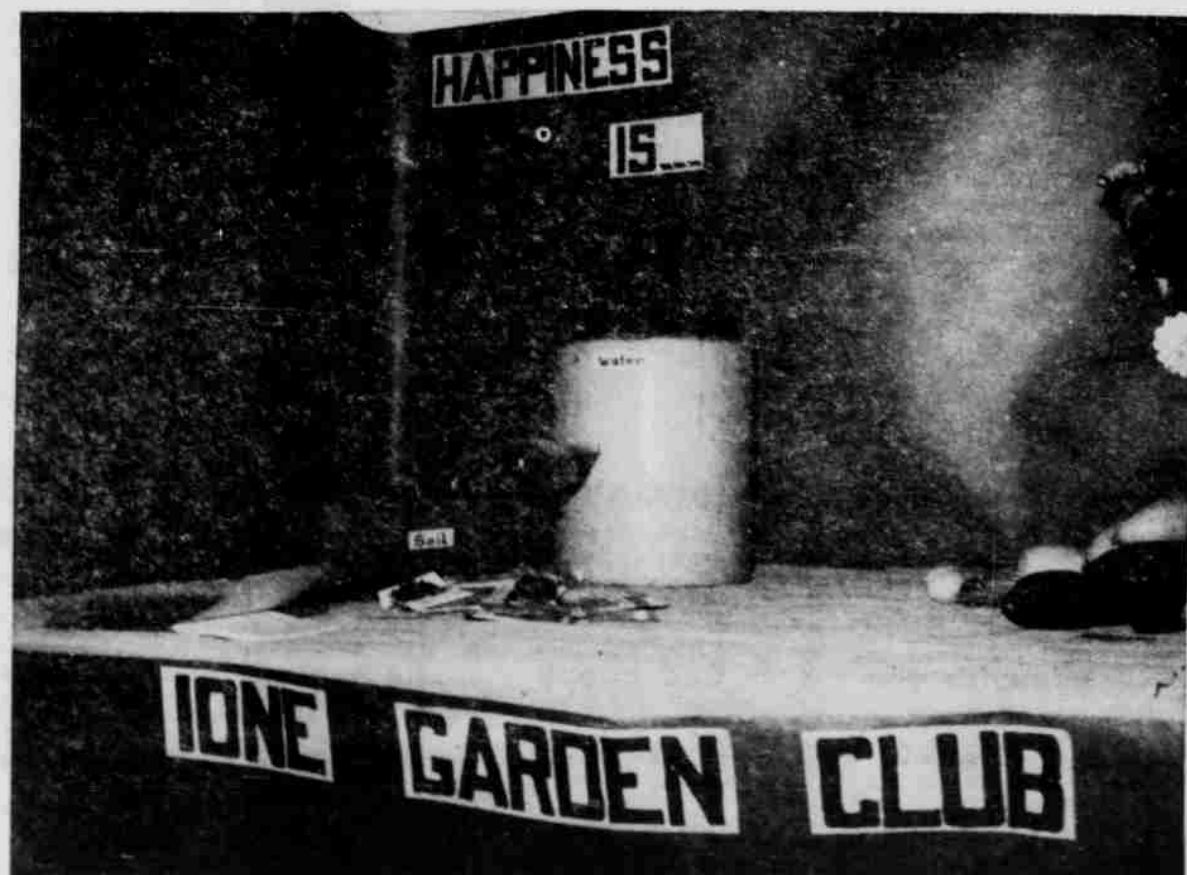
