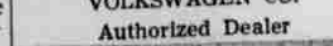

 All state-owned submersible and submerged lands in the bed of the Columbia River lying within 130 feet measured at right angles to the high water line fronting and abutting the following described parcel of real property, to-wit:

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Weed Control For Small Grain

Weed Control recommendations for small grain crops in Oregon have been summarized in a four page circular just published by the Oregon State University Cooperative Extension Service, reports Harold Kerr, Morrow Extension Agent.

Prepared by Rex Warren, OSU extension farm crops specialist, the circular lists recommended weed control measures for wheat, barley and oats.

"Good weed control in grain crops requires proper selection of herbicides and proper timing of application as to stage of growth of weeds and grain," Warren points out, while stressing that growers must follow label instructions for use carefully to avoid unwanted effects.

Also available is a fact sheet which rates the various chemicals in their effectiveness to control common weeds in Eastern Oregon wheat fields. The fact

sheet was prepared by Don Rydrych from the Pendleton Experiment Station, and Rex Warren, Farm Crops Specialist from OSU.

A third bulletin entitled "Estimated Costs of Wheat Production in the Columbia Basin of Oregon" is also available. The bulletin shows cost of production for various size wheat ranches under varying soil and climatic conditions.
