Pruning

Homeowners who are puzzled about when, how or why to prune ornamental trees and shrubs now have a handy guide to help them make those decisions, announced Harold Kerr, County Extension Agent.

It is a new circular just published by OSU Extension Service and written by Les Fuchigami, OSU assistant professor of horticulture, and Ray McNeillan, Multnomah county extension agent.

Entitled "Pruning ornamental Trees & Shrubs", single copies of the circular are free to Oregon residents at extension offices or from the OSU Bulletin clerk, Corvallis 97331.

Pruning is one of the more important cultural practices in caring for trees and shrubs, the authors note. It is the single most vital method for modifying plant growth to adjust it to garden conditions. Pruning is also done to maintain plant health and to increase the plants' quality.

The circular provides handy tips as to when, how much and how to prune trees and shrubs as well as providing information about pruning equipment and the theory of pruning.
