The money from the sale is to be used for a furnace for the Spray Church.



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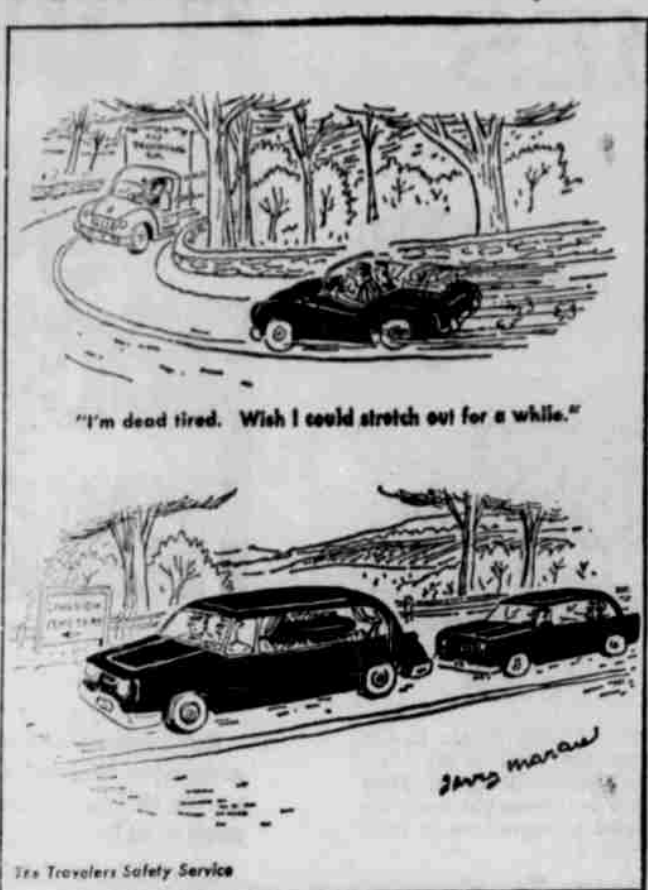
