**Heppnerite Observes 50th Anniversary**

A 50th wedding anniversary celebration was held mid-October at St. Vincent de Paul Church in Salem for Mr. and Mrs. Albert Amort of Salem.

They were married Oct. 15, 1920 in Portland. Mr. Amort was manager, Asphalt Division, Shell Oil Co. in Portland and retired in 1951. Since retirement they have

lived 14 years in McMinnville and five years in Salem.

Mr. Amort grew up in Corvallis and graduated from OAC (OSU) in 1916. He worked with the Oregon State Highway Dept. until 1928 when he went with Shell. He had been transferred to Seattle and San Francisco as well as Portland.

Mrs. Amort grew up in Heppner and graduated from Monmouth Normal (OCE) in 1918. Their children are John A. Amort of Pendleton; Helen Wickenheiser, Portland; Mrs. Joseph King, San Pedro, Calif., and 14 grandchildren.

Mrs. Amort will be remembered in Heppner as Melba Griffith. She was reared by her uncle and aunt, John Ancil Patterson and Rebecca Ellen Griffith Patterson.

Mrs. Patterson died May 10, 1957 at 100 years old, at the Eastern Star Home in Forest Grove where she had lived since 1941.

"Aunt Beck" as she was known here was the widow of a pioneer druggist. Prior to his going into the drug business he was a railroad man and was the engineer on the first train ever to come to Heppner.

Mrs. Patterson was born in Wisconsin and was married to John Patterson when she was 16. In the late 1890's they moved to Heppner and were among those who survived the flood of 1903.

She was a charter member of Ruth chapter of the Order of Eastern Star.

At the time of her death Mrs. Patterson was survived only by two nieces, Mrs. Albert Amort and Mrs. Waldron.

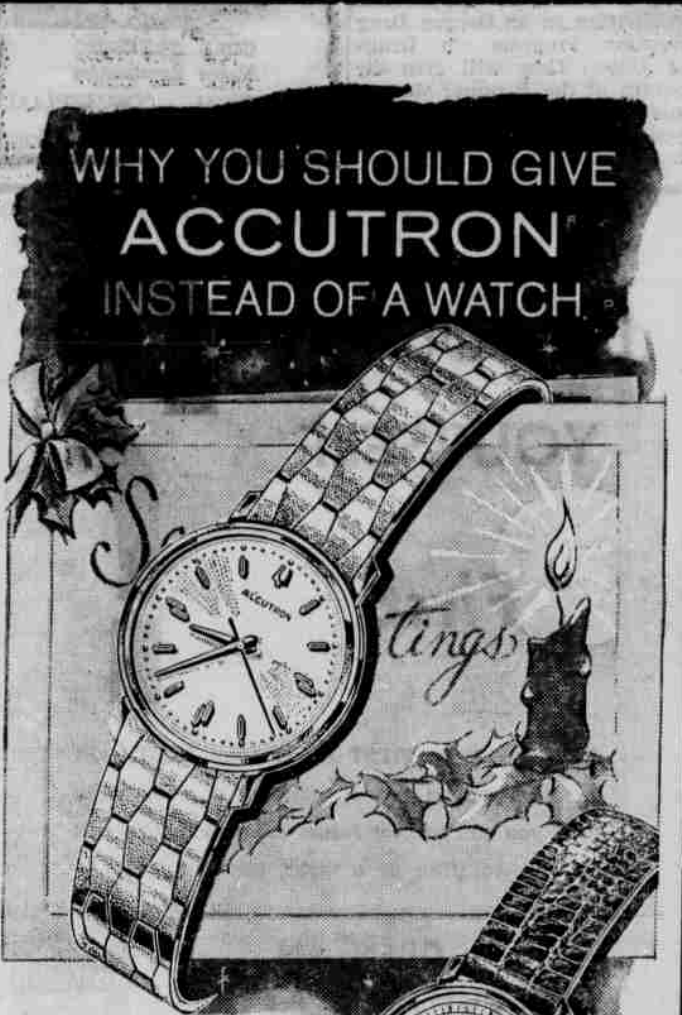
**Granges Plan Four-in-One Installation**
