Morrow County Has 31 at OSU

Nearly 13,000 of the 15,508 students attending Oregon State University this year are from Morrow County.

About 2100 students come from 35 other states in the U.S. and nearly 400 from 48 foreign countries. The number of non-residents is down considerably from previous years, however, because of limitations imposed this fall.

As expected, Benton County has the most students at OSU, 3403. Multnomah is next with 2598; Marion, 1141; Linn, 774; Lane, 749; Clackamas, 560; Washington, 446; Douglas, 293; Jackson, 293; and Yamhill, 253.

The Morrow County breakdown shows 21 men and 10 women. Sixteen students are from Heppner; 7 from Ione; 3 each from Boardman and Lexington; 2 from Irrigon.
