Don Munkers of the Morrow County Road Department was the instructor assisted by Gifford Price from the State Department of Emergency Services, formerly Civil Defense. Mr. Munkers has taken a number of courses to qualify as an instructor. He feels that it is essential that monitors be trained throughout the area. "It is the only way we have of measuring the fall-out. The government doesn't provide this service but does provide the instruction so we can teach it ourselves". C. J. D. Bauman in charge of Morrow County's Emergency Services arranged the sessions.

Following films and instruction, the class was given problems in a work book.

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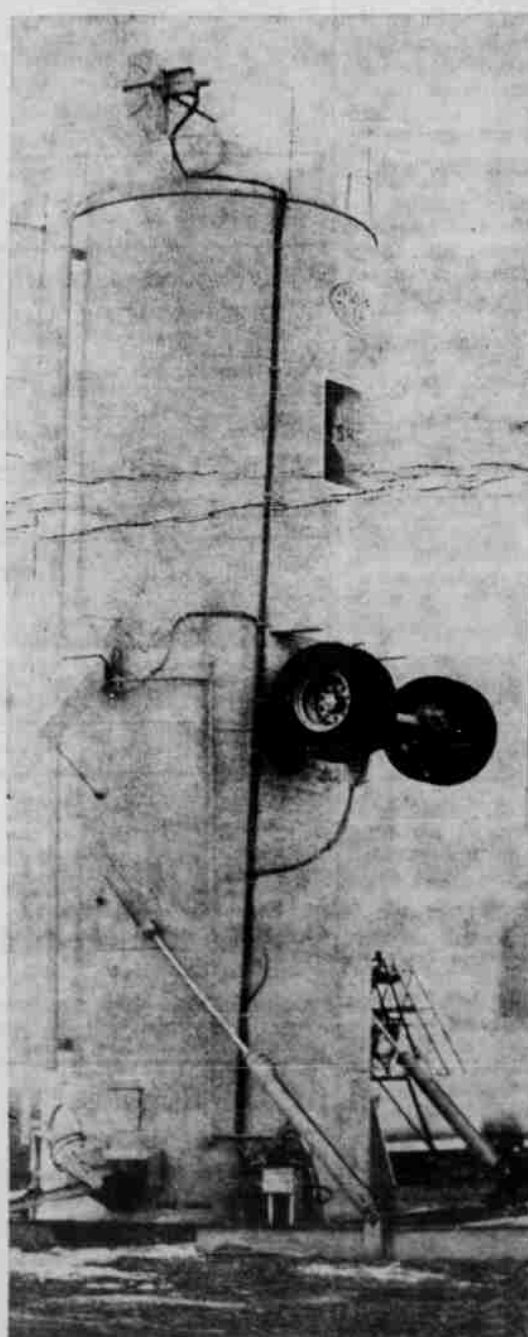
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
