Figure Your Christmas Tree Lighting Needs by Measurement

Multiply the height of the tree by the width, then multiply by three for maximum amount of lights needed. For minimum amount divide total in half.

To place the lights, start at the top and spiral around and down the tree. Check the light positions before placing other decorations. For safety's sake, be sure each socket contains a light and that lighting decorations have an UL (Underwriter Laboratory's) inspection seal.

Over 200 New TB Cases In Oregon This Year

Teamwork? It conquers disease — as well as space!

"Let's stick together" is the theme of the Christmas Seal Campaign which began the week of Nov. 10, 1970 with the mailing of this year's new and interestingly different Christmas Seals to about 45,000 families in the seven county Eastern Region of the Oregon Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association.

"And don't forget the public, all those people who have contributed to Christmas Seals throughout the years," continued Mrs. Jones. "They're part of the team, too." Without Christmas Seal funds, we'd be considerably retarded in our struggle against tuberculosis. By saying "Let's Stick Together," we are calling on "everyone" to help in the fight against disease.

The State of Oregon has had 228 new TB cases reported so far this year of 1970.
