### 1912 News Writer

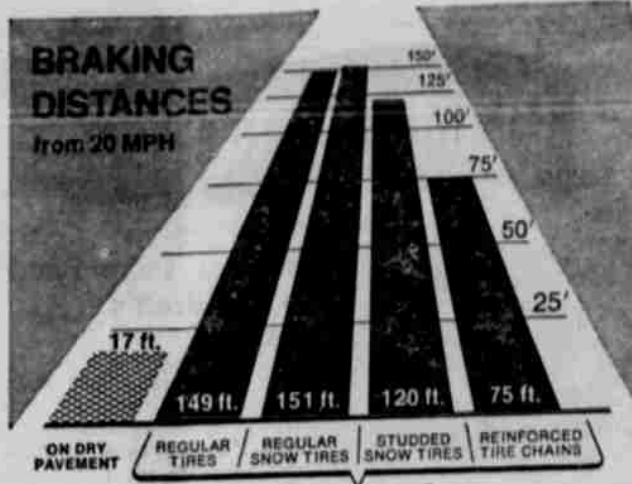

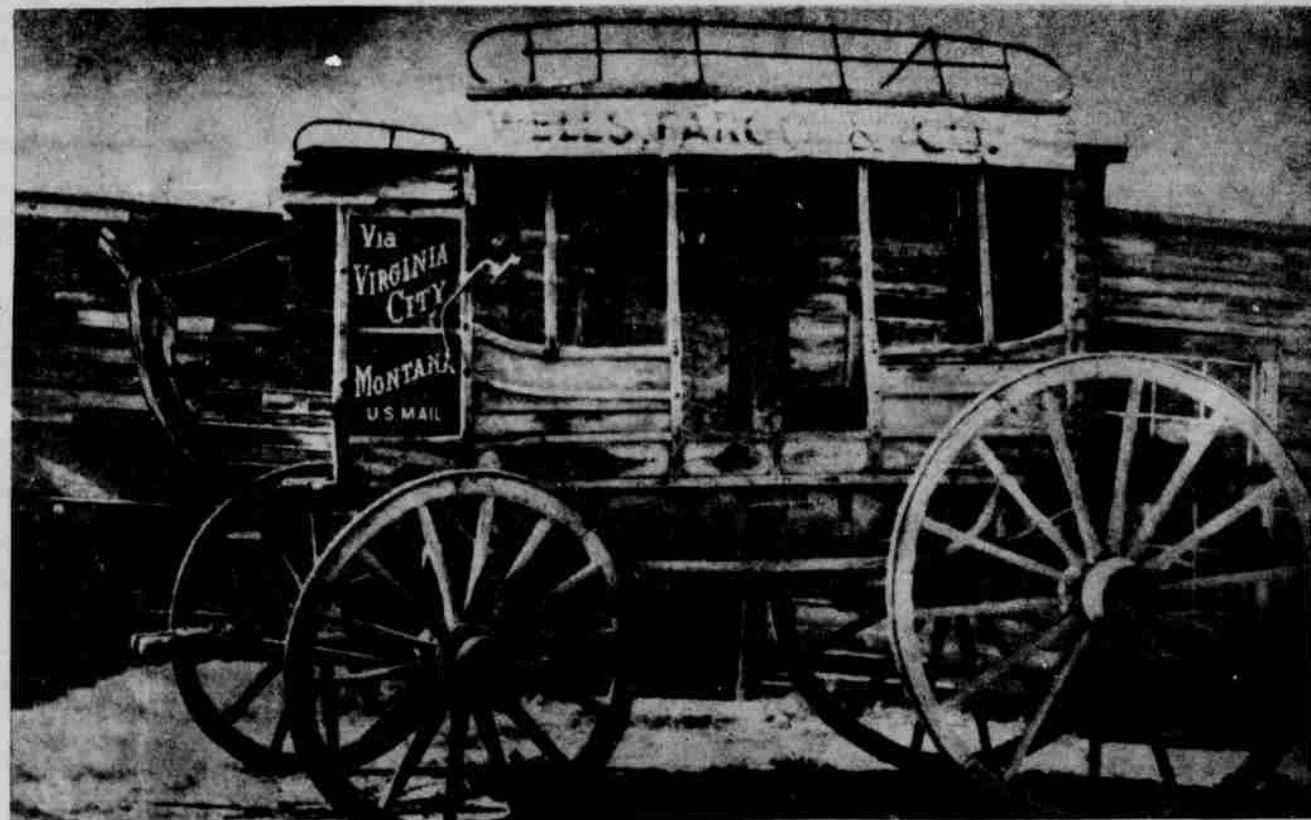
