He spoke of cures, "kicking drugs". In teaching he feels they must quit using scare tactics as they simply don't work.

The community, he said, must learn a few simple facts about drugs. We need education to know what to do — there is a need to keep the environment simple.

Mr. Horn said he hoped as time passed to further explain the subject to people.

Mrs. Erwin said there will be local education on drugs. Much, of course, will have to be handled individually.

When asked if there was drug use in Heppner, Mr. Horn said marijuana is in the community during homecoming and rodeo time. He doesn't think there is a pusher here.
