Free throws, as usual, proved to be fatal for Heppner as they made 12 for 31.

**Free Diabetes Survey Planned**

A community detection survey to find unknown cases of diabetes is planned for Morrow County, according to Dr. L. D. Tibbles, County Health Officer.

The blood testing program will be conducted at Heppner on March 8, at the Methodist Church, between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. and again, on the same date, between 7:00 and 9:00 p.m. On March 9 at the Masonic Hall in Ione, between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. and, on the same date, at the Riverside High School in Boardman from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

This testing program is free to the public. Doctor Tibbles said, "We are particularly interested in testing those persons who are either overweight, over age 40, blood relatives of a known diabetic, or are mothers who have had babies weighing 9-pounds or more at birth". These are the so called "High Risk" persons, who are most apt to have diabetes and not know it.

According to Dr. Tibbles, "Unknown and untreated diabetes is potentially a disease condition which can lead to blindness, heart and blood vessel disease, chronic infections and even death". Diabetics who discover their disease early can usually be treated successfully and lead a fairly normal life with few, if any, restrictions on their daily work or recreational activities.

This diabetes survey is being sponsored by the Morrow County Extension Homemakers Advisory Committee and the Morrow

County Health Department with the assistance of the Oregon State Board of Health.
