Dowis is a consulting engineer for Douglas United Nuclear of Hanford. He has had 27 years of experience in this field and showed concepts for locating the plant and for using the coolant waters for irrigation. There are some 100,000 acres of land in the area that could be brought under irrigation from a nuclear plant. This would bring a financial boost to the economy of the entire area. Presently around 85% of the young people leave to seek employment.
