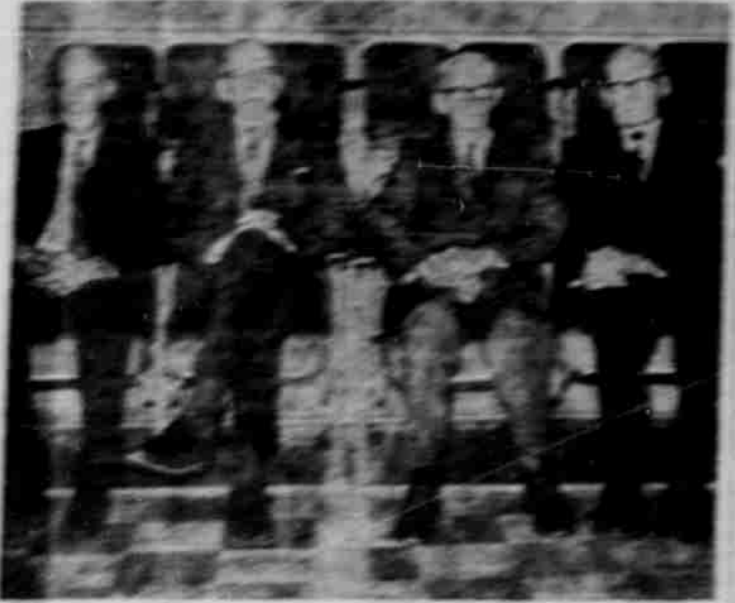

Form Storage Loan Program Liberalizes

Storage facilities for grain and other storable crops are as necessary for many modern farms as specialized planting and harvesting equipment, according to David McLeod, Executive Director of Morrow County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service Office, (ASCS). Hepper, who announced changes for the loan program for farm storage.

A lower loan interest rate and an increase in the maximum loan amount are among the changes in the program include.

"Lowering the interest rate on loans to 30 cents per \$100 per month, which is a 6 percent annual rate. The loan rate had been 7 1/2 percent.

"Increasing the maximum loan or outstanding aggregate balance from \$25,000 to \$50,000.

"Removing restrictions on various items of equipment essential to the practical operation of the storage unit.

"Removing restrictions on items of furnishings and educational writing in the loans.

These program changes will help farmers install modern on-farm storage facilities.

"Almost every sector of agriculture is participating in a technological and marketing revolution. Crop storage is included in this tremendous change which has given this country the most efficient food production system the world has ever known," McLeod said.

Through use of both on-farm and commercial storage, farmers are better able to avoid a harvesting glut, make more effective use of transportation facilities, and spread their marketing over a longer period," McLeod said.

Under the farm storage plan program, eligible farmers can obtain Commodity Credit Corporation loans through their local ASCS Office to buy or build on-farm storage facilities and to buy essential operating equipment.

Loans can be made for storage needs based on two-year production of a producer's crop which are eligible for price support in Morrow County these are: wheat, barley, oats, corn, rice, and dry edible beans.

4-H Summer School Applications in Mail

Applications to attend the 1971 4-H Summer School at Oregon State University June 14-19 will be in the mail next week to Morrow County 4-H members, reports Gail McCarty, county extension agent.

Some 1,800 young people 12 and older are expected to attend the 56th annual event on the Corvallis campus. Morrow county will be able to send 23 members.

Theme of the 1971 session is "Meet Someone Halfway." During the five days, 4-H members will participate in classes, tours and discussions aimed at introducing them to various careers and college life as well as live in college dormitories and hear outstanding speakers, says Gail McCarty, OSU 4-H and youth specialist.

Additional application blanks for Summer School are available from the county extension office for 4-H members who do not receive them in the mail next week.

Individual 4-H members should return their applications directly to the county extension office by April 12. Applications must be signed by the 4-H leader.

Selection of the county's summer school delegates will be made shortly after April 12.

"All 4-H members who were 13 before Jan. 1 are eligible to attend with the exception of those who have gone three times already," Mr. McCarty explained. Many organizations in the county have made scholarships available to help offset the \$35 cost. The delegates will pay \$5 with the participating donors giving \$30.

4-H Stock Judging Here

Dr. John Landers, OSU Extension Livestock Specialist, and several Morrow County 4-H members provided instruction on livestock showing and fitting for some 90 4-H members, parents and leaders on the fairgrounds March 13. Landers explained what the judge was looking for and how showmen can obtain these desirable features. The 4-H members then demonstrated those points as well as some of the common errors unexperienced showmen most commonly make.

Bringing animals and presenting demonstrations were: David Richards - swine; Peggy Schlichting - dairy goat; Susan Healy, Karen Richards, Kyrin Robinson - sheep; Sandy Bennett - dairy; Kyle Robinson - beef.

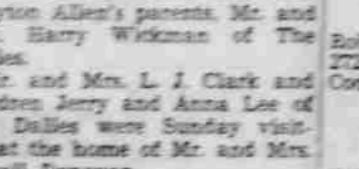
