

Local Boys Figure in Umatilla Races

Even the weatherman seemed to join local fans for a real treat at Umatilla Speedway Sunday last week as he held back threatening wind and rain storms for this year's opening race. Morrow county fans did not have to be disappointed in the performance of the local boys. The next Speedway Race is April 11. Time trials at 1 p.m. and races at 2.

Limited modifieds ran just the trophy dash and main as only 3 of the thundering machines showed up. John Thorpe collected the hardware and the main. Clyde Fought 2nd and George Keenan 3rd.

The limited sportsmen put on the show of the day with a good field of cars, about half coming from the Tri-Cities and the rest locally-owned.

Harvey Adken had fast time and took the dash in his No. 80 Ford, followed by Steve Dickman, No. 40 Ford; Edie Jones, Butter Creek, No. 36 Ford and Rick Erz, No. 17 Chev.

First heat went to Pat Johnson, No. 77 and Bob Hernandez, No. 66.

Second heat was taken by Ron McKinstry, Heppner, in a Harry Phillips sponsored Chev. No. 1, followed by Harvey Adken No. 80.

In the main, Ron McKinstry really set out to deliver the milk as he wove his way through the pack in an effort to overtake Dickman, but was hooked on the back stretch and spun out where he had to be content with watching the finish go to 1st, Steve Dickman, No. 40; 2nd Eddie Jones, No. 36; 3rd Bob Hernandez, No. 66; 4th Harvey Adken, No. 80; 5th, Montie Stieber, No. 5; 6th Jerry Gilliam, No. 37 and 7th, John Eynon, No. 77. Hard luck award had to go to Herb Shaw, No. 38, who blew his transmission during warm up.

In the Figure 8, Stan Rauch, Lexington, No. 4 had fast time. Bob Sweeney No. 3 collected the trophy with Dale Badoux No. 59. Stan Rauch No. 4 and Bob Durbin No. 15, crossing in that order.

The heat was the usual slam banger with lots of action. Joe Lugoner, 1969 champion, lost a tire from his No. 82 '58 Plymouth early in the race which left it wide open from Ron McKinstry. In a Harry Phillips sponsored 1960 Dodge No. 83, Stan Rauch pushed his No. 4 1949 Ford, from the rear of the pack to challenge last year's champion, Ron McKinstry, but spun on the final lap and relinquished 2nd spot to Dale Badoux, in his 1958 Ford No. 59.

Finish was: 1st Ron McKinstry No. 83; 2nd Dale Badoux, No. 59; 3rd, Stan Rauch No. 4; 4th, Bob Sweeney No. 3; 5th Dwight Crum, No. 38; 6th, Jerry Simmons No. 64; 7th, Chuck Rieber No. 69 and 8th, Bob Durbin No. 15.

Only nine of the mechanical delinquents could be mustered to start the main. Two spun out early and McKinstry had to sit it out on the east end with a flat. Bob Sweeney, No. 3 Olds failed to anchor soon enough at the intersection which brought out the red flag and left Durbin upside down in his No. 15 1956 Chrysler. After a restart the remaining four finished: 1st Joe Lugoner No. 82; 2nd Stan Rauch No. 4; 3rd Dale Badoux, No. 59; 4th Tom Tomkins No. 37.
