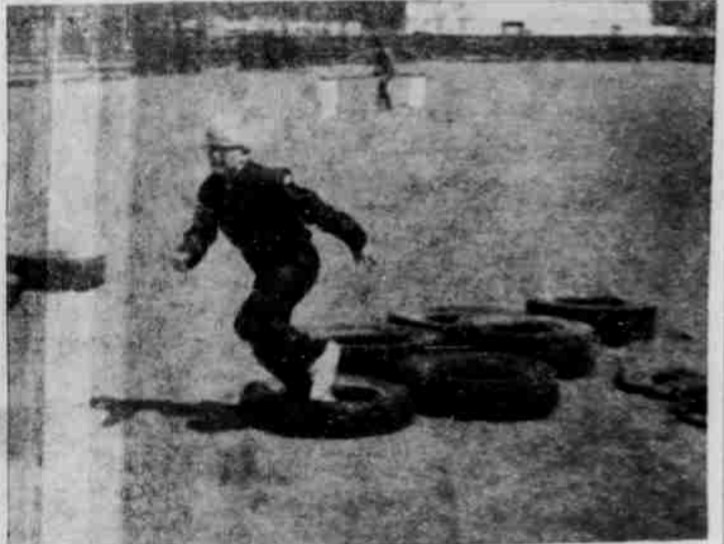


Heppner Cub Scouts Participate In Scout O'Rama at Hermiston

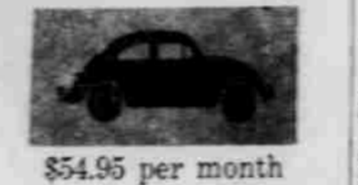
