

4-H Summer School Delegates To Go

Twenty three Morrow County 4-H members will attend 4-H Summer School at the campus of OSU, Corvallis, June 14-19. Marge Shade, Irrigon will travel with the group as chaperone.

The group will travel by bus and will be joined at Biggs Junction by Karen Floyd, Sherman County Home Agent, and the Sherman County Summer School delegation. Karen will supervise both Morrow and Sherman delegates on campus.

Elected as County Representatives at Summer School orientation, May 19, were David Richards, Irrigon, and Joan Healy, Heppner. County representatives are assigned many leadership roles during the week long session.

New sessions added to the Summer School curriculum this year for a limited number of the older delegates are teen leadership and Community Pride classes. Kelley Wolff, Kathleen Bartlett and Sharon Witherite will participate in teen leadership. Shauna Bergstrom will attend Community Pride sessions.

Summer School delegates are selected from applications submitted by a committee of 4-H leaders and local businessmen. Recent changes in Summer School rules limited the number of times an individual member may attend, and changed county quotas to a percentage of enrolled 4-H members of Summer School age.

This year applications to attend were almost twice the number of Morrow County quota. Attending 4-H Summer School is a privilege that 4-H members work to achieve.

Gene Pierce, President, Bank of Eastern Oregon, is again acting as chairman of the South Morrow 4-H Summer School Scholarship collection. Assisting with collections in Ione area is Mrs. Howard Crowell, in Lexington, Mrs. Bob Davidson.

Morrow County businesses and organizations contribute scholarships of \$30 each for delegates attending. Cost of attending summer school this year is \$35. Each delegate will pay \$5 of the scholarship cost, plus \$3.00 for transportation.

Informative Tour of Devil's Half Acre Scheduled Sunday

The Morrow County Rifle and Pistol Club and Blue Mountain Elks Conservation Club of Pendleton are jointly sponsoring a public tour of Devil's Half Acre on Sunday, June 6.

The four-wheel drive trip will begin at 10:00 a.m. from Cutsforth Park and cover the Devil's Den area. Officials from the Federal Forest Service and the Game Commission will be on hand to describe the problems and evaluate the timber.

The groups hope to be granted a moratorium on the shallow logging operations in that area in order to establish a study area of the animal population in relation to logged areas.

Devil's Half Acre is one of

the few areas left which affords a natural habitat for elk. Without the timber and with increased human harassment, it is felt the elk will become a scarce commodity.

Another problem caused by logging of this land would be soil erosion with the mud and silt emptying the Cutsforth Park water supply and Willow Creek.

The public is encouraged to attend this informative tour to gain worthwhile knowledge of the existing problems. It is hoped the area could be developed into a daytime recreation area with an eye on conservation. This can only be accomplished by local cooperation and enthusiasm.
