el tire repair, bus tire change, panel tire change and oil filter. Moore's Texaco at Boardman also was a bidder.

### Contract Bus Runs

The only bus run to have more than one bidder was the Ione-Morgan-Cecil run. Art Stefani bid .2375 for the 88 miles at a total cost of \$3,699.30 and Adon Hamlett bid .21 at a cost of \$3,270.96. Don McElligott, Ione's representative on the board, was not present. The Ione Advisory Council would not be meeting until August to provide any feelings they had on the bids. Due to the closeness to the start of school, the board felt it would not be fair to table the decision until the August meeting.

The board named Adon Hamlett to the run. Mrs. Hamlett who attended the meeting indicated that they had no rig as yet but that if they got the bid they would obtain one. Mr. Stefani who had the run last year has the same rig as he used last year.

Price per mile went up considerably higher on the other two runs where there was no competition. Bob Peterson .29 per mile for a run of 28 miles at a total cost of \$1437.24 on the Peterson-McElligott run.

Lois Hunt .315 for the Huber-Campbell-Davis run of 51.3 miles at a total cost of \$2,860.32.

### New Contracts

Donald Cole's contract at Heppner Elementary principal was approved. He has his BA from EOC. He is on Step 8 of the Salary Schedule MA plus 30 with a salary of \$13,770.

Raymond Maynard who taught math half-year at Pilot Rock last year was approved for the Heppner Jr. High math position. He has his BA from EOC. He is classed as a beginning teacher as the district doesn't recognize less than a year of teaching. His salary will be \$6900.

Connie Skinner was approved for the English and Girls' PE position at Riverside High School. She has her BA from Washington State. Her starting salary is also \$6900.

Audrey Jones' contract is for Special Education teacher at Heppner Elementary. She has her BA from EWSC at Cheney. Supt. Daniels said the first 2 or 3 weeks of school would be spent in organizing the class with students coming from Ione and Heppner. If only 6 or 7 qualify on state standards, the districts anticipate expanding the class to

12 and would assume all the cost of the program. There are two openings left in the district. They are the coaching position at Ione and the English-foreign language position also at Ione. Mr. Daniels said he had been holding off for a Spanish teacher. Spanish has been the foreign language offered at Ione. If one doesn't show up shortly, he is prepared to offer a contract to a teacher with an English major and a French minor. Mrs. Winter asked if this would leave a one-year Spanish student dangling. It appears that this would not be the case at Ione High School.

### Financial Report

Mr. Daniels in his financial report said "if the Boeing decision goes against the district, it won't affect the budget. We won't be in bad shape." A cash carry-over for the past two years will just about cover the \$125,000, the amount that would be required to repay Boeing. This year receipts were over-realized by \$20,000 and underspent by \$50,000.

New chairman, Jerry Peck, administered the oath of office at the beginning of the meeting to Pauline Winter, new one-year board member, replacing Beverly Gunderson, resigned.

The board approved an extended contract to Vic Marchek who is working on a non-graded math program for Riverside High School. If this program proves successful, it may be expanded into the other schools of the county. His salary will be \$175 a week.

Due to the lateness of the hour consideration of the district reading improvement program, and a report of the summer Title I program by Mr. Tolar and the summer maintenance and remodeling program were postponed.

### Housekeeping

The board authorized the superintendent to apply for PL 89-10 and PL 874 funds.

Mahoney and Abrams was designated as attorney for the district for 1971-72 and Witherell, Witherell & Morrison as auditors.

Supt. Daniels was appointed budget officer for 1972-73. The deputy clerk was designated to be the sole signer of school district checks and First National Bank and Bank of Eastern Oregon as district depositories for 1971-72.

The FFA pickup was provided by a Fossil firm last year. This year Fullerton Chev. of Heppner

will provide the Heppner FFA pickup for FFA use only at no charge. It is expected the FFA boys will put from 4000 to 5000 miles on the vehicle.

Due to late harvest the Long Range Planning Committee meeting will be held late in August or September.

Vo-Ag instructors, Principals and Superintendents were named as personnel who could order surplus state property.

The auditors started on the books on Monday. It is hoped that they may be through their reports and will report to the board at the August meeting.

Mr. Dalto and Mr. Daniels informed the board of the trouble experienced with the irrigation pump at Riverside High School. The submersible pump had to be pulled along with 296 feet of pipe. A new motor had to be installed on the pump. Problems seem to develop with the re-

surge of power every time the power is off. Four motors have had to be rewound and the dimmer switch rewired twice. The district will look into an installation that will regulate the flow of electricity to eliminate this problem.

Another problem at Riverside High is developing as last summer in the dry well. It is filling about a foot a month. There are two alternatives explained Mr. Daniels. The dry well area could be extended or a line could be run to tie into the storm sewer line of the city. This water is run off from the heat pump and may be used for irrigation. The next regular meeting will be Aug. 16 at 8 p.m. at the District office. Meeting adjourned about 11 p.m.
