Pre-Registration is Desired at BMCC

Summer pre-registration interviews are advisable because more time can be spent with each student, and counseling can be accomplished in a calmer atmosphere, according to Dean of Students Arnold Seeborg.

"Most students need some guidance and more time to start thinking about realistic goals and course schedules before the hectic days of registration," Seeborg said.

During the summer interviews, placement tests are interpreted for students, course outlines explained, academic advisors assigned, and papers made ready for final registration.

Although appointments are desired, they are not necessary. Students may drop in at the college Counseling Center during normal week-day hours of Tuesday evenings.

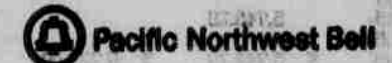
Mr. and Mrs. Mike Snyder and family have purchased a home in Hermiston, and have moved from Irrigon.
