'Ears with Which To Hear'

In the last book of your Bible (the Revelation or Apocalypse) there is a phrase which is repeated time and again. "He that hath ears to hear let him hear what the Spirit saith". Just previous to this you would have read in Rev. 1:2,3—"The Word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ . . . Blessed is he that readeth and they that hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written therein; for the time is at hand". Is it possible that in order for us to hear God's Voice we must read His Word (the Bible) with an open heart and willing mind? It's repetition proves that God knows we will have difficulty in being attentive.

In the story of Odysseus which is Greek mythology there is an interesting account related to "hearing". Odysseus with his companions were approaching the Siren's Isle. These sirens had such wonderful voices and flattering tongues that they were able to beguile to death all who would come within their range. But having been warned of this Odysseus took a thick round of wax and cut it into pellets and after molding them with his fingers, he plugged up the ears of all of his crew. Then by previous command they in turn bound him hand and foot and fastened him upright against the mast. Quote — "So they sang in lovely tones. From the bottom of my heart I (Odysseus) longed to listen, and I ordered the men to set me free, nodding my head and working my brows, but they simply went on pulling with a good swing. Perimedes and Eurylochus at once got up and put more ropes around me and fastened me tighter. But when we had gone a long way past the Sirens, so that we could hear them no longer, my companions took out the wax from their ears and untied my ropes". unquote. We all have Sirens — clamoring for your attention but "take up and read His Word". "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" is relevant to both Isaiah's time and ours.

In the story by Bunyan called "Pilgrim's Progress" which is as follows: "I saw a man clothed with rags, standing in a certain place, with his face from his own house, a book in his hand, and a great burden upon his back." It was not long afterward that he met one called

"Evangelist" who then gave him a parchment roll which had inscribed therein — "Flee from the Wrath to come". After he had received more explicit instructions (as to which way he should hasten for freedom from his great burden) we read: "So I saw in my dream that the man began to run. Now, he had not ran far from his own door, but his wife and children, perceiving it, began to cry after him to return; but the man put his fingers in his ears and ran on crying "Life Life Eternal Life".

PROPERTY TAX FAX

If you have a question concerning real or personal property please state all the facts as briefly as possible and mail it to your COUNTY ASSESSOR Joyce Ritch, under the name "PROPERTY TAX FAX". Please ask only one question per sheet. Then watch this column for the answer.

QUESTION:
I purchased 5 acres of land on contract and would like to pay taxes on this land separately. The assessor refused to divide out my parcel of land unless I furnished him with a copy of my contract. I offered to submit copies of my contract, which is not recorded, but I would like to strike out certain parts of the contract including the sale price. Does he have the authority to do this?

ANSWER:
Yes. The statute, ORS 311.280, expressly provides that an assessment division is not made unless a true copy of the contract of sale is given to the assessor. A true copy of the contract of sale means a copy of the contract without striking therefrom any substantial portion of it such as the conditions of sale and the sales price.
