Mr. and Mrs. Dale Jones and son Bobby were business visitors to Heppner last Saturday.

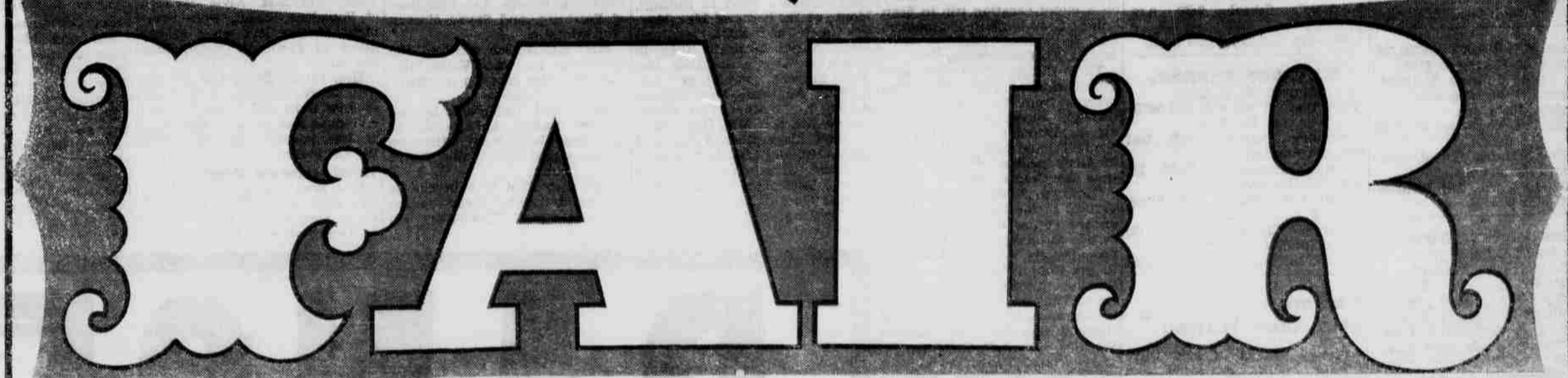
