Competition In Dog Obedience And Showmanship

Dogs have always been man's best friend, when he does what man wants him to do. This year's 4-H Dog Fun Match included six major class divisions as obedience trials, these including, Sub-Novice; Novice; Graduate Novice; Open; Open Challenge and Utility. Classes were open to all 4-H dog members but only premiums were paid to Morrow county exhibitors. Premiums were blue—\$5.00, red—\$4.00 and white—\$3.00. Showmanship and dog obedience were both judged. Bonnie Clow and Sandy Graham were superintendents.

Lauri Larson of Pendleton had a high score of 189, receiving a blue ribbon in the novice and graduate novice division. Linda Bard also of Pendleton, also received a blue ribbon and a score of 157. Debbie Childs of Hermiston received a blue ribbon and a score of 173. Sharon Barth of Pendleton received a score of 176, in addition to a blue ribbon and Debbie Keltz of Stanfield received a red ribbon and a score of 152. There were no Morrow county entries in this division.

Carmen Clow Only Morrow Entry
Under the classification of sub-novice, intermediate, Susan Barth of Pendleton received a blue ribbon, with a score of 170 and also reserved champion. From Hermiston, Teresa Mallary, had a score of 191, a blue ribbon and champion. Carmen Clow, the only entry from Heppner in this division received a red ribbon with a score of 157 and Sharon Peck of Hermiston also received a red ribbon with a score of 166½.

Dixie McDaniels Reserve Champion

In the junior showmanship division, Janet Freeman of Pendleton received a high score of 96½, in addition to a blue ribbon and champion. Second was Dixie McDaniel of Hardman with a score of 94, receiving a blue ribbon and reserve champion. Those receiving blue ribbons were Ron Larson of Pendleton, score 90; Jeff Kaoren of Pendleton, score 87, and Sharon Barth of Pendleton, score 88. Eric Clow of Heppner received a red ribbon with a score of 86, Cindy Kerr of Heppner, red ribbon with a score of 80½ and Julie Malcom of Heppner, red ribbon with the score of 79.

School Kids to Have Hearing Tests

Audiometric testing in Morrow County Schools is scheduled for Sept. 28 and 29, according to an announcement received by Dr. L. D. Tibbles, Health Officer, Morrow County Health Department.

As part of the Hearing Conservation Program, Maternal and Child Health Section, Oregon State Board of Health, a qualified audiometrist will test the hearing acuity of kindergarten, first, third, fifth, and seventh grades, as well as referrals from any other grades made by teachers or the nurse.
