She won Blue plus and State Fair and Champion on her sewing in Jr. Miss B and Blue and State Fair on her knitting. In the Style Revue she was knitting Senior Champion and Reserve Champion in Senior Clothing. The outcome of it all she was then awarded ALL-OVER GRAND CHAMPION at the Style Revue.

She later won Reserve Champion at the State Fair on her knitting, a brown plaid poncho with beige knit binding. At the Morrow County Style Revue she wore both her poncho and her navy blue dress of polyester with white ties lacing the front and on the pockets.

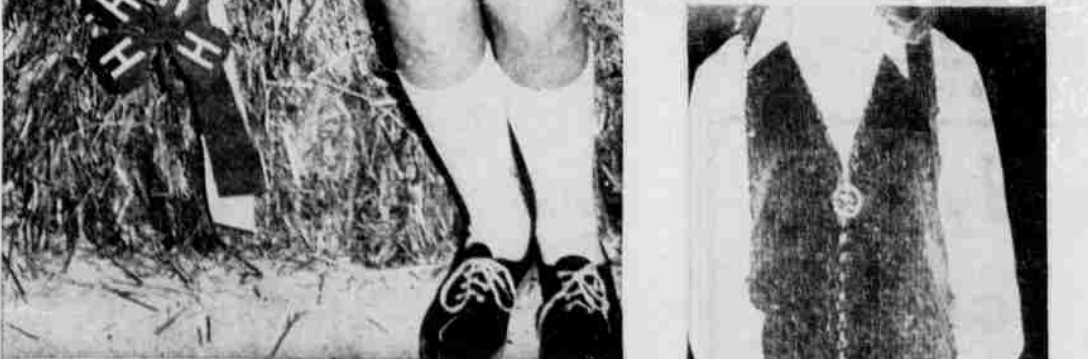
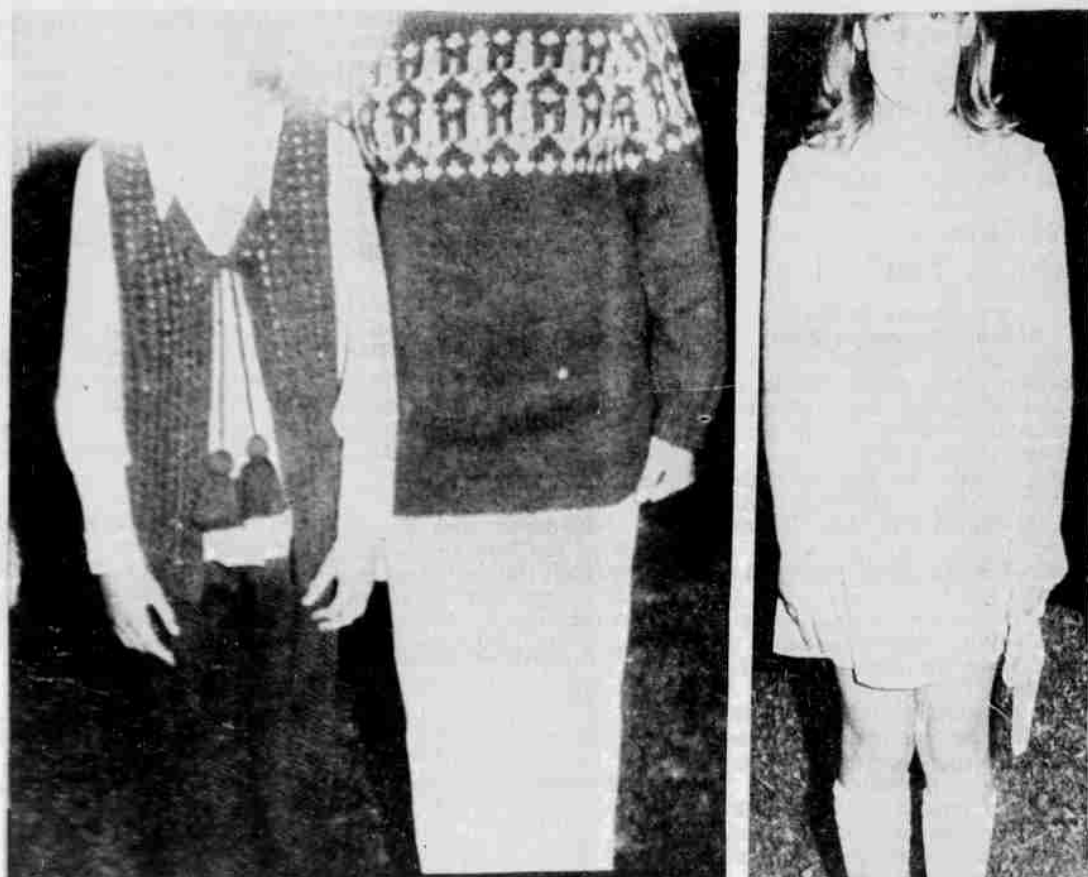
Besides the idea of a speaker, they plan a contest on hand decorated litter bags. They suggest big sacks or shopping bags. There will be two divisions with three prizes in each.
