Section 4. That the recorder be and she is hereby instructed to publish notice of said election and of said proposed charter amendment in the Heppner Gazette Times, a newspaper published in the City of Heppner, once a week for two successive weeks, the first publication thereof to be more than 15 days prior to the election. The recorder shall also post notices of election in at least six public and conspicuous places in the city at least 10 days prior to said election which posted notice shall state the time, place and purposes of the election but need not contain the full amendment.

Section 5. That the proposed charter amendment referred to the City of Heppner by the common council be as follows:

AN ACT

To amend the charter of the City of Heppner, Oregon, by adding thereto Article VII authorizing the reconstruction of bridges, streets, and swimming pool, damaged by flood and the relocation of utilities proposed to reduce further flood damage for the City of Heppner; and the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$94,000.00 to provide funds therefor. Be it enacted by the people of the City of Heppner, Oregon, that the charter of said city be amended by adding thereto Article VII to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII

(a) The common council of the City of Heppner, Morrow County, Oregon, is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to issue and sell general obligation, negotiable coupon bonds of said city in a sum or sums not to exceed \$94,000.00. Said bonds are to be used for the purpose of reconstruction of bridges, streets and swimming pool, damaged by flood, and the relocation of utilities proposed to reduce further flood damage. Said bonds are to be in denominations of \$1,000.00 duly signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the City Recorder, where by the City of Heppner promises to pay the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum therein stated in lawful money of the United States of America, with interest thereon in like lawful money at a rate not to exceed 6% per annum payable semi-annually, each of said bonds to be a General obligation of the City of Heppner, and to be dated at a convenient time to be fixed by the common council to mature serially, as determined by the council, provided that the date of maturity shall not in any event exceed 20 years from the date of issue. The principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the office of the treasurer in the City of Heppner, and said bonds shall be known as "City of Heppner Flood Damage Repair and Improvement Bonds - 1971" and shall be advertised and sold as provided by the laws of the State of Oregon.

(b) That the debt limitations contained in the charter of the City of Heppner shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized nor shall any other provision and limitation of said charter apply.

(c) Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes, include such levy and sums sufficient to be used jointly with other funds as may be received from operating revenues to pay the interest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

Section 6. That the proposed charter amendment here referred to the people of the City of Heppner by the common council shall be balloted upon at said time and place under the ballot title fixed by the council by this resolution as follows:

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the common council:

Section 1. That a proposed amendment to the charter of the City of Heppner be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Heppner, Morrow County, Oregon, for their adoption or rejection and a special municipal election be held as herein provided.

Section 2. That the date of the special municipal election when the proposition to authorize the sale of \$94,000.00 general obligation bonds shall be submitted to the voters is the 17th day of September, 1971, and that the polling place be and hereby is designated as the former Library Room of the City of Heppner City Hall on Willow Street of said city and the polls shall be open at the hour of 8:00 o'clock A.M., Pacific Daylight Time and closed at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., Pacific Daylight Time, on said date.

Section 3. That the following qualified persons are hereby appointed judges and clerks of said election, to-wit:

Section 7. It is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the city that the election herein provided shall be held at as early a date as possible and in order so to do this resolution take effect immediately, now therefore,

An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect upon its adoption and approval. Adopted by the council this 20th day of August, 1971, by the following vote:

That all or substantially all of the lands within the above described boundaries will be benefited by the construction of drainage, flood, or surface water control works, including, but not limited to the improvement of the channel of Willow Creek and Shobe Canyon from flowing into the lands within the area known as Heppner during high water periods of Willow Creek and Shobe Canyon.

That the creation of a water control district and the construction of dikes, and the installation of pumping plants and the construction of other surface water control works will be of benefit to the lands within said district and that the construction of said works will be conducive to the public health, welfare, or safety.

WHEREFORE, the petitioners pray that the lands included within the above described boundaries be organized as a water control district under and pursuant to the provisions of ORS 553.010 to 553.820, and the Court enter an order fixing a time and place for the first hearing on this petition, at which hearing the Court shall determine whether the creation of said district will be of benefit to the lands within the district upon its creation and whether the creation of the district will be conducive to the public health, welfare, or safety, and if the Court shall find that the creation of the district will be of benefit to lands within the district, the Court shall fix and determine the boundaries for the district, and that the Board of County Commissioners shall direct the County Clerk of Morrow County, State of Oregon, to give notice of such first hearing by the publication of such notice once a week.

PETITION

We, the undersigned owners of land lying within the boundaries hereinafter described, hereby petition the above-entitled County Court for the creation of a water control district under and pursuant to the provisions of ORS, Chapter 553.010 to 553.820 and in support thereof respectfully represent to the Court:

1. That the name of said district is Heppner Water Control District.

2. That the boundaries proposed for said district are as follows:
