Blue Mountain Community College's day enrollment reached 1105 when registration closed Monday, President Wallace W. McCrae announced this week. The figure represents an eight per cent increase over day enrollment last year, when the peak headcount reached 1026. The increase is the same as last year's and brings the college's enrollment up to the number expected, McCrae said.

The day figure does not include persons enrolled in the evening division classes being held on the campus and in Athena, Lexington, Hermiston and Heppner. Additional classes are being planned for Milton-Freewater.
