### Homeowner Tax Relief Explained

Sheriff John Mollahan announced today that when property tax statements were mailed in early October, each contained a Homeowner's Tax Relief Application even though not all are eligible for tax reduction under the law passed by the 1971 Legislature and effective beginning with the 1971-72 tax year.

Under the new law, the Department of Revenue, State of Oregon, and county tax collectors are cooperating in administering the new concept of homeowners' property tax relief, which is based on "household income" rather than the age of the resident as the primary basis for granting relief on owner-occupied homesteads.

There are two pages of instructions accompanying the application. Filing must be done after Dec. 31, 1971, and not later than April 15, 1972. Relief cannot be granted for the year if the application is filed after April 15, 1972, and no extension of time to file can be granted, Sheriff Mollahan emphasizes.

"Taxpayers may receive their 3-percent discount by paying in full before Nov. 15, 1971, and still apply for and receive relief after Jan. 1, 1972," Sheriff Mollahan said. Those not paying in advance but expecting to qualify or persons needing assistance or additional information after reading the instructions accompanying the application form are advised to contact the county tax collector's office in the courthouse in Heppner after Dec. 31, 1971.
