 I, the undersigned, Mayor of the City of Heppner, Oregon, do hereby proclaim that at the special city election, called and held in said city on the 8th day of November, 1971, at which time was submitted to the voters of the City of Heppner the adoption or rejection, a certain charter amendment, the title of which was as follows: Charter Amendment Submitted to the Voters by the Council. Shall the Charter of the City of Heppner, Oregon, be amended by adding thereto Article VII, authorizing the issuance of General Obligation Bonds in the amount of Nine Hundred and Forty Thousand Dollars (\$94,000.00) to provide funds with which to reconstruct bridges, streets, and swimming pool, damaged by flood, and to relocate utilities exposed to reduce further flood damage?

**Tax Status Of Mobile Homes Told**

Persons living in mobile homes or travel trailers which have been placed on the assessment roll are entitled to claim such property for purposes of the 1971 homeowners' property tax relief law, Sheriff Mollahan explained today in answer to questions from such property owners.

The sheriff emphasizes, however, that mobile homes and other vehicles licensed by the Motor Vehicles Division of the State Department of Transportation do not qualify as "homesteads" under the new law.  
 Mobile homes or travel trailers which qualify as homesteads are put on the assessment rolls by the county assessor either as real property, when the land is also owned by the taxpayer, or as personal property for those situated in mobile home or trailer parks.

If such homesteads were not put on the assessment roll this year, no homeowner property tax relief can be gained from the new law. However, a law passed by the 1971 legislature will require that all mobile homes over 8 feet wide be placed on the 1972 assessment roll and therefore will automatically qualify as a homestead for future years. Mobile homes 8 feet wide or less will be considered a homestead if used as a home and the owner requests that it be placed on the assessment roll.

**Machinery Management Workshops**

A two-day machinery management workshop is being held in the dormitory building at the fairgrounds on Monday and Tuesday, Nov. 22 and 23. Instructors will be Gene Nelson and Clinton Reader, Extension Economists, Oregon State University. Hours are 9:30 to 3:30 each day.

Emphasis of the workshops will be on the economic analysis of the machinery investment decisions. Part of the workshop will be devoted to an examination of the attitudes and criteria which affect machinery management decisions. Considerations regarding the size of machinery to buy and when to trade machinery will be studied. The alternatives of joint ownership, custom farming, and leasing will also be examined. The income tax effects will be an important consideration.

A registration fee of \$5 will be charged for the materials to be distributed and other expenses of these workshops.
