

### Meet Will Hear Wheat Research

Wheat research will be one of the main topics on Tuesday, Nov. 30 during the 44th annual convention of the Oregon Wheat Growers League at the Sheraton Hotel in Portland.

A panel will be moderated by Thomas Thompson, County Extension Agent from Wasco County. Panel speakers and topics will be:

"Trends in OSU Plant Breeding Programs, (Both Food & Feed)"—Warren Kronstad, Associate Professor of Agronomy, OSU.

"Weed Control and Chemical Tillage Research in Wheat"—Don Rydrych, Assistant Agronomist, OSU.

"Disease Research in Wheat"—Robert Powelson, Assistant Professor of Plant Pathology, OSU.

"Research in Soil Fertility"—Hugh Gardner, Soil Extension Specialist, OSU.

"Private Lands and Environment" will be the topic of Robert Baum, Pacific Area Program Advisor for the National Association Conservation Districts at the Tuesday luncheon.

In the afternoon session, the group will hear from Gene Moos, Edwall, Wn., President of the National Association of Wheat Growers and Bud Dunham, Nez Perce, Idaho, President of Western Wheat Associates.

William Lubersky, who was instrumental in writing the farm labor bill which was vetoed will also appear on the program discussing "Labor and The Strike."

The ladies will leave the hotel Tuesday morning at 11:00 a.m. for a luncheon and a guided tour of OMSL Tuesday also will be highlighted by the annual banquet at which the cake baking winner and the conservation winner will be honored.

The convention will be concluded the morning of Dec. 1 with the adoption of resolutions and election of officers for the coming year.
