Lung Sections Given To County Schools

The Eastern Region Oregon Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Assn., are presenting schools in each of the counties, handsomely encased lung section display cases. The normal and emphysematous lung sections were given as a Christmas Seal service to enhance health education and improved respiratory health. Morrow County received three.

Don Cole, principal of Heppner Elementary said, "I feel the 'real lung' displays will provide an excellent visual educational tool for students and assist in up-grading health education studies."

The cases are beautifully finished in blond varnished wood with brass hinges so they can be displayed in trophy cases on a year-round basis when not in use for classroom purposes.

The lung sections may be removed when not on display so that students may handle sections of normal and lungs damaged by emphysema.

The Christmas Seal Campaign is now underway. Everyone is urged to mail his contribution in answer to the Christmas Seal letter.
