NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that written, sealed bids will be received at the office of the City Recorder of the City of Heppner, Oregon, City Hall, on or before the 13th day of December, 1971, at the hour of 2:00 P.M., and immediately thereafter publicly opened for the purchase of \$94,000.00 General Obligation Bonds of the City of Heppner, Morrow County, Oregon. Said bonds shall be in denominations of \$1,000.00 each, to bear interest at the rate, or rates, not to exceed 6% per annum in any one year, payable semi-annually, principal and interest to be payable at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Heppner, Oregon. Said bonds shall be dated December 15, 1971, and shall mature serially as follows:

The lands will be sold subject to a reservation to the United States of rights-of-way for ditches or canals under the act of August 30, 1890 (26 Stat. 391; 43 U.S.C. sec. 945), and all oil and gas will be reserved to the United States, pursuant to the Act of July 17, 1914 (30 U.S.C. 121-123). Parcels No. 1 and 2 will be sold subject to rights-of-way for Federal aid highways. Parcels No. 2, 3, 4 and 5 will be sold subject to rights-of-way for electric transmission lines and access roads as constructed by the United States.

If the tracts are not sold on March 7, 1972, the sale will be adjourned and the tracts reoffered for sale on each succeeding Tuesday at 10:00 A.M., at the Oregon State Office, Bureau of Land Management, until sold; but if not sold by September 5, 1972, the sale will be closed on that date.
