**Helen Hayes' Book, 'On Reflection' is Outstanding**

**A Lovely Legacy**

In setting down all the family stories, the backstage anecdotes, and her recollections of spiritual struggle, Helen Hayes has produced a legacy for all of us. After years of unwillingness to discuss her private world — which even her best-selling book "A Gift of Joy" did not do — she has looked beyond her legend and directly at Life's lessons as she was forced to learn them. Deeply moving and affectionately witty, her story is an affirmation of the faith that first gave it impetus.

The book is dedicated to Charlie and Mary, past and future. At the close of the dedication she includes these thoughts, "Cast by the fates as Helen Hayes, I have played the part for all its worth... We play many parts in this world, and I want you to know them all — for together they make the whole. Trials and errors, hits and misses. I have enjoyed my life. And so — in highlights and shadows, bits and pieces, in recalling moments, scenes and acts of folly — all chiaroscuro and confetti — this is what it was like to be me, all the me's; what it was like to live in such exciting times and know so many of the men and women who made it so."

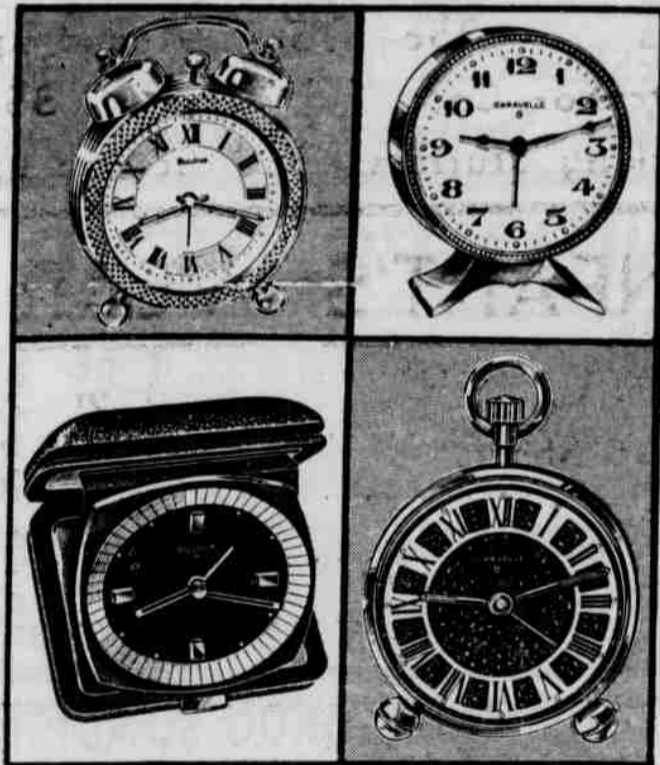
