### Mexico Excites Three Couples

Three Heppner couples, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Anderson, Mr. and Mrs. Clint McQuarrie, and Mr. and Mrs. Harry O'Donnell returned last week from a delightful look about central and southern Mexico — lucky folks! Marie McQuarrie has kindly given us some of her impressions of some of the things they saw which especially interested her.

These couples took an American Express tour and were gone two weeks and two days. They flew to Mexico City, toured by bus for 1325 miles, and had their final visit at the coastal resort of Acapulco.

Marie was impressed with the great size of the capital city and also with Guadalajara, a second large city to the west of Mexico City. She said Acapulco on the west coast, which has grown so fast recently, is a lovely tourist spot where she could easily have stayed even longer than the two extra days they spent there.

Marie found Mexico an exciting place of some striking contrasts. It has very wealthy people with huge estates and many very poor who live in little adobe huts. The lot of the poor is improving however, under the present socialist regime. The Heppner party appreciated the fine guide their tour provided. This man believes in the socialist reforms and looks for more improvements for Mexico's poor. He, incidentally, had attended Spokane's Gonzaga University. He enlightened the tourists over a loud speaker as they drove about in the air-conditioned bus.

She enjoyed the street vendors and learned to haggle over prices. Her advice is to first offer just one half of what they ask—then if they refuse, start up very slowly, and one finds that the final price is considerably below the first price asked.

The tourists found the elevations tiring at first. Mexico City is around 7,000 feet above sea level, and other places they visited were as high as 10,000 feet.

Among other impressions Marie related were the experiences of attending a great ballet performance in Mexico City's vast Opera house, of going into several great cathedrals, and of visiting at Taxco, where there are marvelous gardens and terrific crafts shops. One of the churches they visited was the Church of the Virgin of Guadalupe.

The tour group stayed briefly in an ancient Aztec palace which had secret passage ways in which the Aztec people hid from the Spanish conquerors about 510 years ago. They saw the great group of Aztec pyramids, precision built long ago. They marveled at the perfect

construction of the greatest of these pyramids, the one dedicated to the sun, and its twin, dedicated to the moon. They saw ancient Aztec homes that are now being unearthed which are very old yet have quite modern features, including a remarkable sewer system.

One of the features of Mexico City that was most impressive was the sinking of the land on which the city was built, which was a lake or marsh or swamp. Much of the city is sinking; the opera house has sunken one complete story. The huge rather new Hilton Hotel is now very low-sited.

As they rode through farmland and villages she noticed many women washing their family's clothes along the river banks. The women then laid the very clean, even brilliantly white washing on cactus bushes to dry. She points out that though they live simply, the poor folks are very clean. She was also impressed by the farmers at work—some using oxen and some using tractors. Schooling is now compulsory for Mexicans through the sixth grade. They saw many schools and clean dark-haired little students.

Marie found the huge poinsettias exciting — many clusters were up to second-story windows. She took 90 colored pictures and collected many folders and booklets to keep fresh the memories of this delightful trip. She is planning to share her fresh knowledge of Mexico with Mrs. Erwin's and Mrs. Agee's sixth grade classes.
