Mr. and Mrs. Doyal Hubbell were business visitors to Portland Friday.

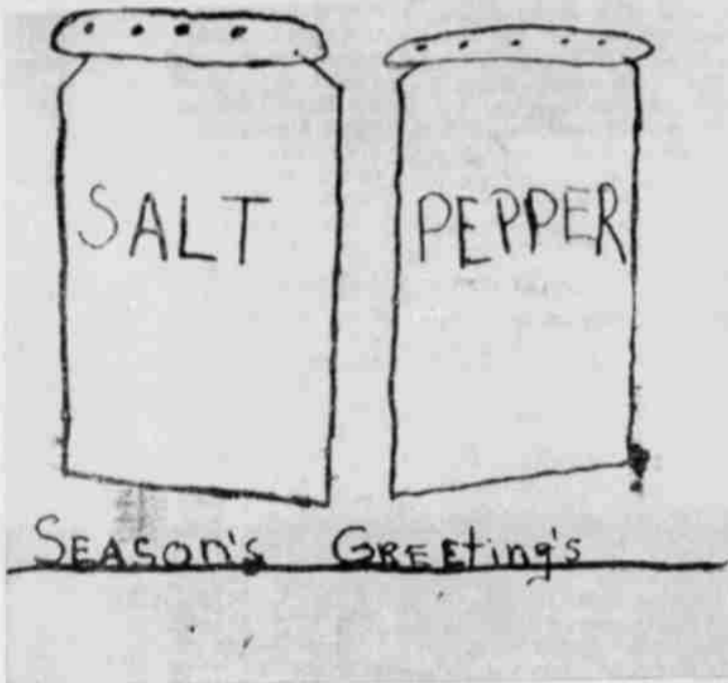

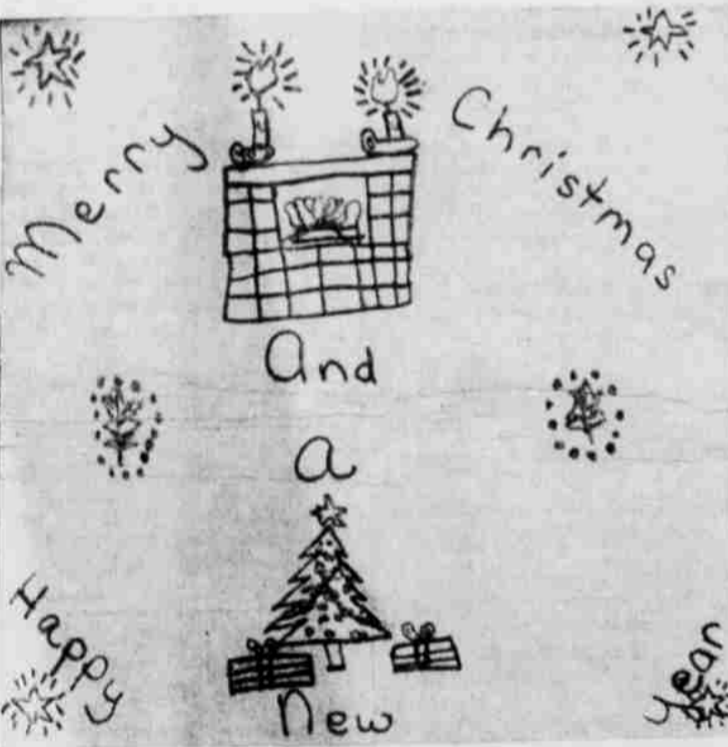
Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Benson went to Portland Thursday on business, returning home during the weekend.

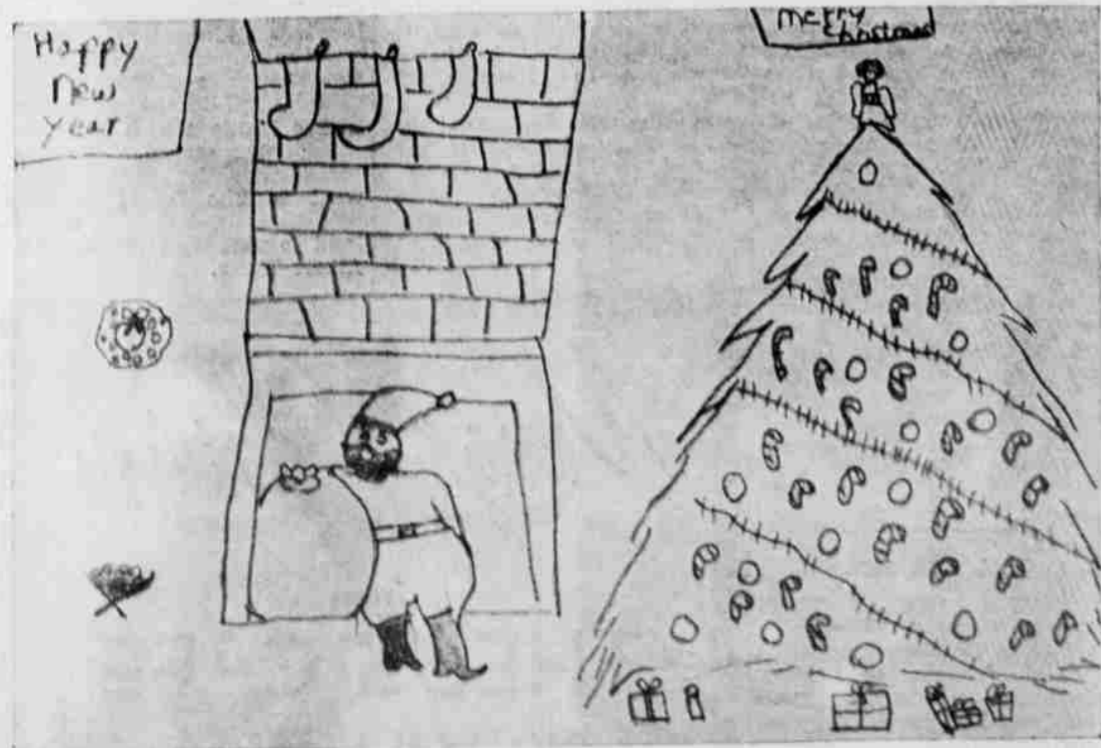
