Morrow Vet Loans Drop

While the Dept. of Veterans Affairs had a record year in Oregon veterans' farm and home loans in 1971 with 7971 loans being granted in amount of \$129,138,850, this did not necessarily follow in Morrow County.

Last year Morrow County had 9 loans in the amount of \$183,150. In 1970 it was 12 loans for a total of \$346,850.

Since 1945, Morrow County has had 141 borrowers for a total of \$1,537,500.
