County Expects To Give Refund On Boeing Land

Morrow County's Assessor, Mrs. Elwayne Bergstrom, said Tuesday that the County had not yet received any official notice of the Supreme Court decision on the Boeing Space Age Park, land near Boardman owned by the Oregon Dept. of Veterans Affairs.

R-1 School Budget Makers Prepared For Boeing Shocker

At the budget meeting Tuesday evening at Lone, Supt. Ron Daniels gave summary of the district's cash carryover and to the Dept. of Veterans' Refund. The figures on the refund are unofficial. The Supreme Court has not yet sent a mandate to the Oregon Tax Court. No interest has been assessed but Mr. Daniels has been advised by the District Attorney that it is usual in past cases of this nature for it to be levied and 6% is the usual amount of the interest.

In making up the budget from year to year, the cash balance in the Morrow County School District budget is not an estimate but is the actual figure left from the previous year. In 1968-69 the cash balance of \$32,628.96 was shown as unappropriated cash. In 1969-70 the Cash balance was \$111,060.29. \$33,000 was put in the 1970-71 budget as cash carryover and \$78,060.29 as unappropriated cash.

figures the School District would be required to refund to the Veterans' Affairs in 1968, \$20,887.80 plus 6% interest for 2 1/2 years \$3,285.81, for a total of \$24,173.61. The 1970 year: refund \$36,700.86 with 6% interest for 1 1/2 years \$3,369.13 for a total of \$40,069.99. The 1971 year: refund \$38,820.73, interest at 6% for 1/2 year \$1,164.89 for a total of \$39,985.62.

G-T To Get A New Look Soon

The Heppner Gazette-Times will be printed by a different method starting next week. The G-T has been printed by "letterpress", a direct printing process from movable metal and wood type. This process has been used continuously since 1883. The Heppner Gazette was founded here Mar. 30, 1883. The Heppner Times was founded Nov. 8, 1897. The two newspapers were consolidated Feb. 15, 1912.

The new process to be used is called "offset." Printing will be done by a lithographic press with a continuous paper web. It is largely a photographic and electronic process. Printing is done on thin aluminum plates and impression goes from this plate to a roller and then from the roller to the paper.
