

Family Life Series Begins April 5

Preliminaries Out of the Way Budget Ready For Knitty Gritties

In spite of inflation and rising costs, several series in the 1972-73 Morrow County School District budget show smaller amounts than last year. The major increase in the requirement section is reflected in salary increases and corresponding increases in Retirement and Social Security. These items account for an increase of \$62,944, or an increase in these items of 5.3 percent. The figures listed include 2 additional certificated staff members and one teacher aide at A. C. Houghton. The new positions listed in the budget reflect one additional teacher at A. C. Houghton and a Curriculum Director on the district level.

Supt. Ron Daniels reviewed each series with explanations and suggestions where further cuts could be made if needed at the second in the series of budget meetings last Tuesday at the lone school.

and the need for such a person has been recognized by most members of the board. This year the position will receive serious consideration due to several factors.

As listed in the Budget message: 1--increased growth in North Morrow County that will require program and facility changes, 2--the need for drastic changes in high school career and vocational classes, 3--Oregon Board of Education regulations requiring subject matter improvement papers, 4--an increase in state and federal funds available for special and innovative programs and 5--increased pressure from the Oregon Board of Education for local districts to become involved in program planning budget systems.

All these items will require additional time and will make it difficult for one person to handle administrative procedures as well as curriculum development.

Also there is a possibility of a vocational counselor position from the Umatilla County IED office. His salary would be 75 percent paid by the state and 25 percent by Umatilla and Morrow County. Figured on a per student basis the cost to Morrow County would be \$500.

Payment in lieu of transportation is increased due to changing from 10c per mile to 15c per mile. Total transportation services are up less than \$500.
