Irrigon Hearing Set on Zoning

IRRIGON—A public hearing will be held by the Irrigon Planning Commission, on the proposed land use zoning ordinance at 7:30 Thursday, Feb. 10, in the Council room of the old School building.

Some changes were made in the proposed zone district lines, at the last Planning Commission meeting. Among these was the elimination of an industrial zone, East of 12th Street and between the Railroad and the Corps of Engineers take line. This area was moved into low density residential which comprises most of the land, outside of government owned, North of the Highway.

A Commercial District lying West of 10th St. on either side of the railroad Right of Way will provide for future business establishments. All other land within the city south of the highway, not included in the commercial zone is proposed as Farm Residential. Building lots in this area are required to be no less than one acre. Some objection may be raised in this area, since 2 owners of separate tracts have plans to sell lots of approximately 1/4 acre.

Ordinance provisions for each district will be presented and an opportunity given for questions and comments.

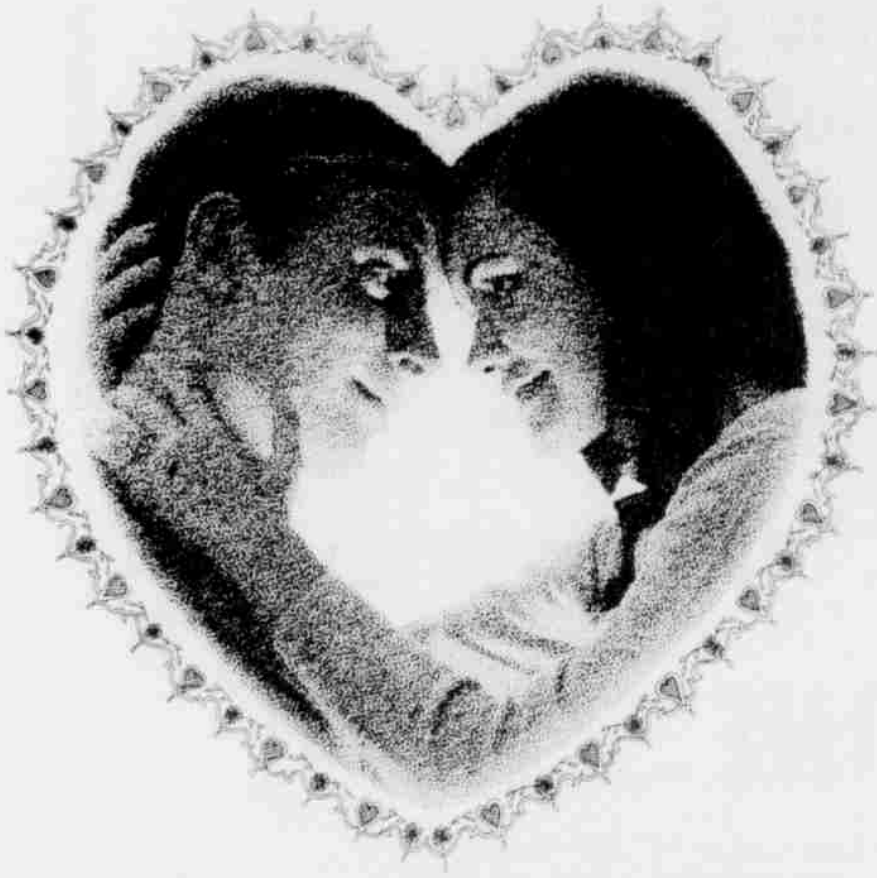
