

MUMS HOLD CHARM OF EASY CULTURE
 Mrs. Fredrick Martin of the Ione Garden Club showed over 100 of her slides on Chrysanthemums at the Heppner Garden Club meeting Monday evening at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Rudy Mensch.
 Prior to the pictures she

gave some high points for raising this flower of "easy culture". It likes the cooler temperatures. It is found in annuals and perennials, singles, doubles, pompoms, spider and spoon, late bloomers and early bloomers.
 They like full sun. The early bloomers that burn in

the sun may thrive in partial shade. Growers in this area will be happier with not so late bloomers as an early frost often catches the late bloomers before they ever show color.
 Other culture pointers given by Mrs. Martin: pinch out the tops until the first

of July to encourage branching, spread manure on the beds in the spring, too much will make the foliage brittle, separate mums every year and reset plants 4 inches apart in clusters of three or four after Easter, place a stake at planting time for later tying. Overhead watering is satisfactory until the

plants get some height then Mrs. Martin recommends ditch irrigation or soakers.
A FEW OF HER CHOICE ones as taken from her slides: Pure gold, Campaigner (Bronze), Snowflake (low white), Cortiss Rice (yellow medium) Helen Bogue (champion pink), Sea Urchin (quill), (early), Autumn Leaves (like
