Specifications have been submitted to Western Electric Co. who manufactures P.N.B.'s equipment, for construction of a switching panel which will be housed locally to meet the community's growing need.

Planning and engineering of the project have been going on for more than a year and is just a portion of the Company's overall plan for upgrading facilities and services according to Slusher. The local project which is tentatively scheduled for service in September of this year, will include underground cable as well as service lines where feasible communication will be less congested than on the present 8 party lines.
