boardman gets new firm

The Port of Morrow finalized a contract last Thursday to locate Ready-Mix Inc. of Milton-Freewater in the east end of the food processing park on the port's industrial property east of Boardman.

Port of Morrow Manager Rupert L. Kennedy said owner Jim Busch will operate the Pott's sand, gravel and rock deposits. At the outset Busch will supply Ready-mix to the area, Kennedy said.

Several operators had made proposals to the port for this type of operation, according to the manager.

The commission established a wharf line on two and a half miles of river frontage it owns in its industrial park. This action gives the port care and custody out 500 feet into the

Columbia River from the high water line. In other action the port moved to purchase 104 acres of land east of Boardman for \$13,014 to get landfill to replace the land that has been mined in recent years for highway construction.

The commission is sending development data to Secretary of Defense Melvin Laird and the Armed Services Committees of both houses of Congress to aid them in the relocation of the Navy bombing range south of Boardman. The Atomic Energy Commission has said the bombing range must be relocated if a nuclear power plant is to be established on the Boeing land southwest of Boardman. Recently an undersecretary of the Navy balked at the idea of the move.

The Boardman City Council at their meeting last Tuesday night asked Mayor Dewey West Jr. to write Morrow County officials and soil conservation districts in the area encouraging the formation of soil erosion districts. The plowing up of thousands of acres of land in the area together with the strong winds prevalent here has created dust problems and the city hall has been receiving complaints from residents.

Therefore, the council feels it is urgent to form a soil erosion district in the area.

The city has received a Certificate of Merit from the Oregon State Health Division for pure water.

Dewey West Jr., mayor of Boardman, has been named Morrow County chairman in the Re-elect Sen. Mark Hatfield campaign. West is a Port of Morrow commissioner and past Port Commission president. He is vice-president of the League of Oregon Cities.

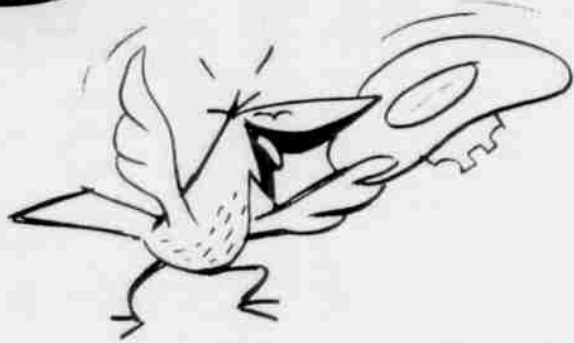

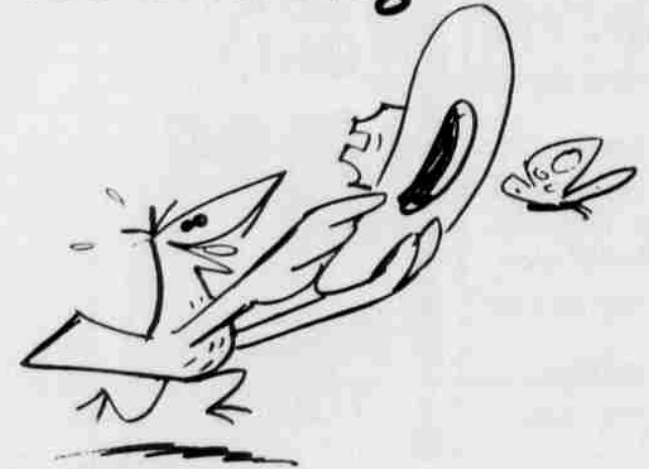
