

## Irrigon's Zoning Approved

The zoning ordinance for the City of Irrigon was the main topic for discussion when the Council met April 11. The ordinance which had been approved by the planning commission and sent to the Council with some changes. Namely: L.R. low density areas, building lot minimum width requirements were changed from 60 to 75 foot with 9000 square foot footage. Areas South of the highway, from the East City limits to Ordinance Rd. with the exception of that zoned commercial, was returned to the originally proposed F.R. Farm residential, requiring 1 acre building lots. A final hearing is scheduled on the ordinance May 11.

Other business included approval of a request by Simms Construction, who has the contract to improve the parks and marinas at Boardman and Irrigon, for rental use of the City's pull type grader for road work.

A permit was authorized for Pacific N.W. Bell to bury an 825 foot telephone cable, South of 13 St. from the highway.

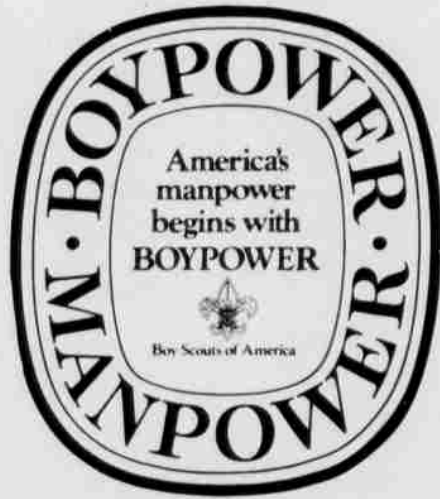
