HEARING ON STATE PREDATOR CONTROL APRIL 20-21

MADRAS-Dave Green, Republican House Candidate from Madras, said today that the Legislature's Interim Committee on Natural Resources will hold a public hearing in Salem April 20-21 to discuss the problem of predator control.

The morning of the 21st will be devoted to testimony by the State Game Commission. The hearing will be in Room 105 of the State Capitol at 9:00 a.m.

Green has been in contact with Rep. Martin on the problem due to the numerous complaints he has received caused by a federal order banning the use of poison in predator control.

Green said that John McKean, Director of the Game Commission, will review his department's proposal on a State Predator Program to replace the program which formerly had been operated by the U.S. Department of the Interior.

Green is advocating a state wide program to help relieve cattle and sheep ranchers of heavy losses due to predators.

Green said he will prepare a full report on the Game Commission's proposal following the April 21 hearing for those interested.
