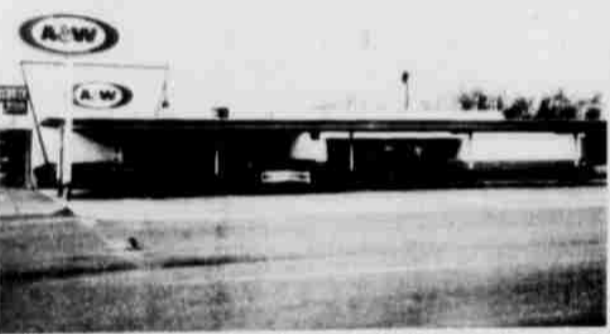

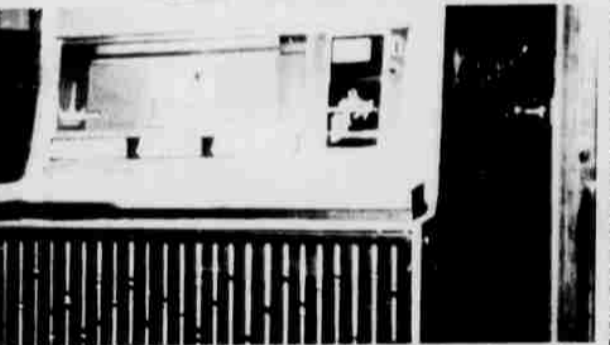

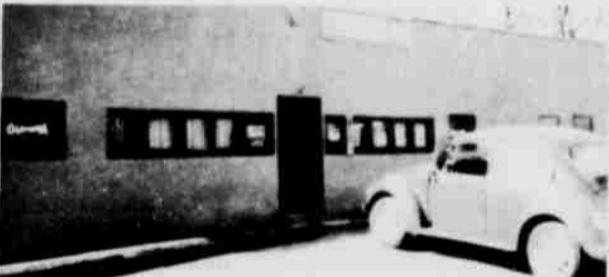

**Forester Advises Thinning of Woodlands**

Warren R. Weathers, Service Forester with the State Forestry Dept. in Pendleton writes that woodland owners should consider adding thinning to their lists of spring tasks.

Precommercially thinned woodlands in North-east Oregon are now producing up to 1500 pounds of measured air dried forage per acre. Net timber growth following thinning has increased up to ten times the previous rate. Summer water yield often increases up to 20 percent above the yield, from an unthinned stand.

Under the Rural Environmental Assistance Program landowners can obtain assistance on up to 40 or 80 percent of their thinning costs. This means as little as 6 to 10 dollars will come from his pocket.

If a woodlot owner is having difficulty finding thinning labor the Oregon State Forestry Department will help him locate a crew. Contact your local Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCA) office for further details on the R.E.A.P. cost sharing program.
