Thousands of dollars of equipment and furnishings have been provided with many tremendously inspiring achievements. Other services have been \$800.00 to the mother of a large family to fly to Mayo Clinic for cancer treatment and scholarships for per-

sons interested in studying nurse's training. Libraries of Enterprise City, Joseph City, Wallowa City and Wallowa County have benefitted from Soroptimist assistance. Two \$200.00 college scholarships are given, outgrowths of the original nursing scholarships. Responding to County needs when Cloverleaf Hall burned a few years ago, Soroptimists gave \$800.00 worth of tables to the replacement building. Talent and puppet shows, flowers in front of Wallowa County Court house, Christmas presents to Hillcrest School for Girls are a few more of this Club's many projects.
