The abundant wildlife and many species of birds were of great interest to the group during their 3-day outing.

Tents were pitched Friday afternoon after visiting the headquarters of the refuge, climbing the lookout tower and touring the museum.

Later, Indian artifact collectors had ample time to search the surrounding area for arrow heads, and bird

watchers piled into vehicles to observe local species.

Saturday morning called for an early start, as the group left camp at 5 a.m. to watch mating Sage Grouse. The remainder of the day was spent touring the refuge with a Malheur biologist and a hike in the Steen's mountains, searching for the different birds of the area.

Camp was broken Sunday at noon and the group started on the long trip home.

A highlight of the trip was a snow shower Friday evening and below freezing temperatures both nights.
