

BOARDMAN PARK DREAM BECOMES A REALITY

Sunday saw a large crowd on hand for the dedication of the Boardman Marine Park. The park has been in the plans since before the construction of the John Day dam. Harold Baker is chairman of the Marine Parkboard and other members are Arthur Allen, Robert Scard, Carroll Donovan and Jerry Peck with Shirley Zielinski as secretary. At one time the Corps of Engineers wanted the park named for persons associated with Lewis & Clark or an Indian name. The Park board felt they wanted a geographical name and so honored Sam Boardman who founded the town, and Marine identifies its position on the river.

The 70 acres in the park includes a swimming basin, two landing strips, picnic areas and overnight camping.

The swimming basin is protected from wave action with styrofoam logs which also prevents boats from entering the area. There are dressing rooms and toilet facilities. Dikes have been completed

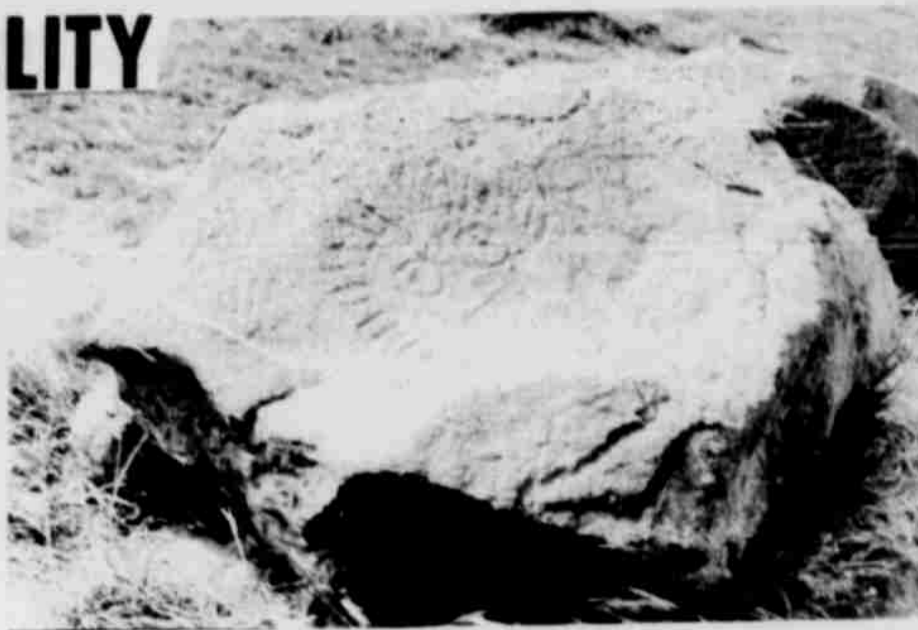
to protect the boat basin from river wave action. The Corp of Engineers has built one slab for boat launching and the Park Board built another one. Piling has been put in the basin in anticipation of a boat moorage. Walkways will be anchored to the piling.

The overnight parking has spaces for 65 travel trailers and camper. There will be hook ups for electricity and sewer. There will be rest rooms.

Top soil has been stock piled for the lawn area around the overnight camping and picnic areas and to the swimming beach. Other areas will be planted to a course grass to keep down the blow.

This will be kept mowed at 10 in.

Rocks with Indian writings will be positioned at the entrance to the park. These Boardman Post Office. may now be seen behind the Boardman Post Office. These would have been inundated by the pool backed up behind the John Day Dam known as the John Day pool.

North Tour attracts many women

The morning tour included a trip through the Desert Magic projects between Boardman and Irrigon and to the National Wildlife Refuge where John Kurtz and Lee Hotchkiss told of the work that is being done along the Columbia river for wildlife.

the Portland area is being tested. Elton Weeks of the Boeing Company explained how this is being done. He stated they are testing areas with one ton to the acre, two tons to the acre, three tons to the acre, and four tons. They find the latter is too much and think the two tons will be more practical.

The last part of the tour was to the irrigated lands of the desert land.
