There is no restriction on the height of farm buildings. Asked whether a farm near a growing city could be zoned out of existence. Generally, no, it couldn't be. It was pointed out that due to pressure from neighbors and perhaps a good price for the land, a farmer might find it preferable to sell. Other possibility would be public condemnation of land if needed for other use.
