Wheat Growers To Visit OSU

Oregon State University will host the quarterly executive committee meeting of the Oregon Wheat Growers League, May 31-June 1, according to Willis Nartz, president. This is a new departure and will give those in attendance a chance to see all the cereal research projects of Oregon State University.

May 31 will be the regular business meeting with emphasis on the proposed budget for the year 1972-73, safety programs, transportation, white wheat situation and other problems facing the producers. On the same evening the group will have dinner followed by an indoctrination of all cereal research projects by the staff of OSU.

On June 1, the group will have a tour of the research laboratories and greenhouse facilities where part of the research programs are conducted. Following this the Hyship farm and the Granger research farms will be viewed. Here they will see the actual research plots under growing conditions. On the way home a stop will be made at the Aurora experiment farm to see additional research plots.

"This should be a very interesting two-day event," said Nartz. He further urges all interested wheat producers to attend as it's not necessary to be on the executive committee to take part in the two day affair. Headquarters is the Towne House Motor Inn, if anyone needs reservations.

Dale Carter of Portland, the driver of the truck was near drowning and unconscious when they got him ashore. Artificial respiration was applied and he had regained consciousness, when the Umatilla ambulance arrived. He spent 2 days in the Umatilla Hospital and was dismissed with no apparent complications.
