The spring concert, presented by students in grades 1-12 will be on May 25.

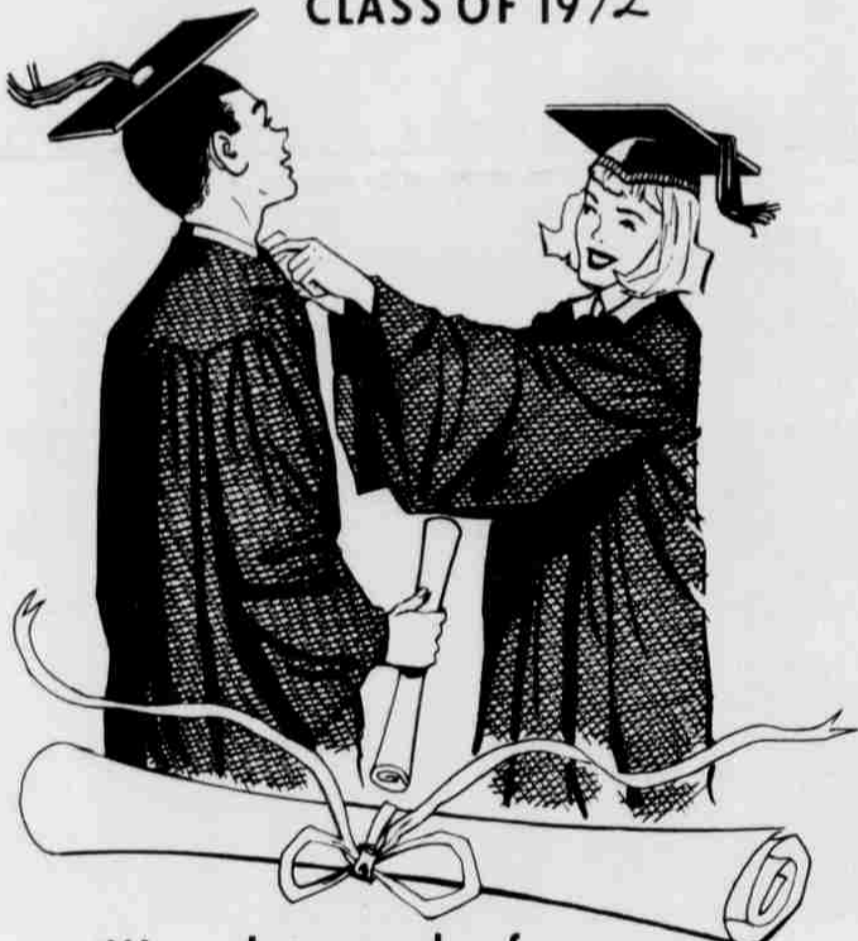
The last day of school for students will be June 1. The teachers will have a workday on June 2. Report cards will be available at the school on June 5, 6, and 7.

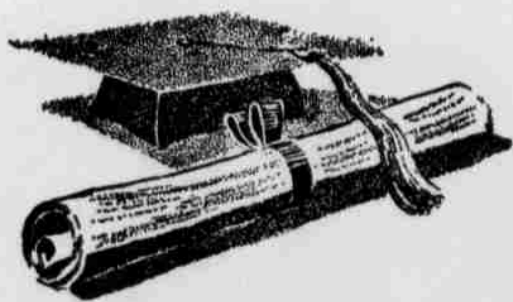
