LONEROCK STORY

The Ghost towns are still attracting travelers and Lonerock was visited recently by Lou Coulter and a friend from California. Lou recalls he came to Lonerock on July 4th many, many years ago. A celebration was in full swing at that time and there were hundreds of people from nearby towns and many Indians from Pendleton and Celilo.

A group of men were lined up for a foot race and betting was going high. Coulter asked if he could take part in the race and was given permission as the audience was betting on their local talent.

What they didn't know was Coulter was the World's Champion Sprinter, and a Stanford University graduate holding the record of 9.4, which held until recent years. He won the race before the others got started. There were 2 other world champions at the celebration. Ted Thy from Portland, wrestler and McCarroll from Pendleton, champion Bull dogger. The crowd called on Ted

to wrestle with McCarroll and allowed him just 12 minutes time. McCarroll was a tough one and when Ted saw he was about to lose he became desperate. He got hold of McCarroll's arm and tightened it around his neck. McCarroll cried out "You are choking me!" "No," replied Ted. "It's your arm that is doing it", and Ted won out.

The wrestling was held at C.D. Robinson's big barn in the lower end of town. Lou Coulter wasn't long in leaving Lonerock after he had collected his race money and told us he was afraid someone would rob him.
